Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Vices and Virtues. When we try to grow in virtue, most always it will involve letting go of a vice! Getting rid of vices,

whether extreme or light, is what the Church is trying to get us to do as we start this season of Lent.



Two stories in this weeks readings, the Fall of

Adam and Eve and the temptations of Jesus, are powerful reminders of this theme. Jesus shows us that temptations can be overcome. However, they can only be overcome with the help of God's word!

Jesus example in the desert reminds us of what to do to grow in virtue. Jesus was humble, faithful, to serve and not be served, and He was ready to pay whatever price this would require of Him. It shows what kind of Son of God he was, that he loved the Father with his whole heart and soul and mind and strength. It is also a reminder to us that no matter how holy we are; no matter how filled we are with the Spirit of God, we still have to guard against the temptations of the devil, for he is interested in leading any one of us astray! It can be hard to resist temptation. Jesus knows this because he experienced temptations. As we journey this Lenten season, it would be good to recall this and know that Jesus is there with us in the desert when we face our temptations. We can always call on Him for help!!!



### **BISHOP ANDERSON. SSE**

Moses B. Anderson, SSE was born on September 9, 1928 in Selma, Alabama, and graduated from Knox Academy

there in 1949. He was a member of the Society of St. Edmund. Anderson then attended Saint Michael's College in Winooski, Vermont, where he majored in philosophy attaining a B.A. and graduating magna cum laude. From there he moved on to St. Edmund Seminary in Burlington, Vermont. He earned an M.S. in Sociology at St. Michael's College in 1961. He also earned an M.A. in Theology at Xavier



University in 1968. During his tenure at Xavier he was a part of a team that formed the Black Catholic Institute.

Anderson was ordained on May 30, 1958. In 1982 he became the first and only African American bishop ordained for the Archdiocese of Detroit. On January 18, 1992, he became the pastor of Precious Blood Parish in Detroit.

He retired in 2003 upon reaching the age of 75; and passed away on January 1, 2013
