Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel from John, chapter 09 is the healing of the blind man by Jesus. Jesus claimed uniqueness as a Divine Teacher. More than that, he was to sacrifice Himself for His sheep, not to be a Master over students. This theme is played out in the gospel this week.

The blind man had his visual site restored. He was also very wise in his knowledge of the miracle than the Phari-

sees. One could say that the progress of the blind man's believe was like the woman at the well; from sir, to prophet, to the Messiah!

This is a program developed by the Kalamazoo Public Safety Department. The one coming up is in May, Saturday, May 6 and May 13. It is open to the public for those living in the Kalamazoo area. It's a wonderful opportunity to open our eyes to see how the public safety system works with the citizens of our community!
