This week we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord! We are reading from the Gospel of Matthew today, which does not mention the Ascension. The Gospel ends with Jesus appear-

ing to the disciples after the resurrection. The Gospel of John only mentions the Ascension in Jesus' comments to Mary Magdalene when He appeared to her. The



Gospel of Mark makes a brief mention of the event. It's really from the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles that we have any details of the event!

Matthew stresses the teaching part of Jesus' ministry as He commissions the apostles. They are to teach all nations what Jesus taught and to baptize them. The Gospel of Matthew starts and ends on a similar note: "God is with us."

As we are getting ready to wrap up our Easter Season, that's a good theme for us to remember God is with us! Especially when we are united with Him in the Eucharist! Have a blessed week!
