## FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This weekend Mass we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. Very often, when our faith celebrates a special feast or solemnity it is because of some controversy. It is the case with this celebration of Corpus Christi. The origin of

this feast dates to the 12th Century responding to debate about the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. When was the first time you can remember seeking to understand Jesus truly present with the gift of his body and blood in the Mass? How would you describe and share this eucharistic faith with a friend today?

Bishop Fulton Sheen in his book, *Life of Christ*, wrote that," everything in nature has to have communion in order to live; and through it what is lower is transformed into what is higher: chemicals into plants, plants into animals, animals into humans. And what about humans? We can be elevated through communion with Jesus who 'came down' from heaven to make us a partaker of the Divine nature."

One way to grow deeper in our appreciation of the Eucharist is to come to Holy Mass one day during the week or come to the adoration chapel for one hour a week! Spending time with the Lord can help us take our Lord's word to heart, "The bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world." Have a blessed day!
