#### FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy Fourth of July! I hope you have safety if you are travelling or just staying at home! The readings for this week give us some wonderful aspects to ponder in our relationship with God!



The readings for the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time encourage us to make our relationship with God first in all we do. The first reading recounts how a woman provided hospitality to Elisha and was rewarded for her generosity. The psalm reminds us that all of the good things in our lives come from God. And in the gospel Jesus tells us that we must stop clinging to our own self-interests in order to follow him.

In fact, Jesus says that we must die to ourselves: "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Matthew 10: 37-42. In today's second reading from St. Paul to the Romans, he states that through baptism that we have died with Christ and rose with him to share in his divine life. It is by baptism that we have the spiritual effects of this sacrament in which we die to selfishness and sin and start a new life in Christ.

American author Herman Melville said, "We cannot live only for ourselves. A thousand fibers connect us with our fellow human beings." As we celebrate the Fourth of July, it's good for us to remember in how many ways we are connected with our fellow people, especially in our country!






