

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Gospel this week emphasizes the need for a community of faith. The community needs to have unity and harmony. Jesus was giving guidelines to be followed in order to restore unity and harmony among the people of the community when there was serious disunity and sin.



At the end of His instruction, Jesus teaches us about our need to pray with one another. We need to pray on our own. However, there is a unique power in praying with others. It's like a log in a fireplace! One log has a hard time burning. When you add other logs, one can have a nice fire! Praying is like this!

Tomorrow is the twenty-second memorial of 911. We need to lift up in prayer those who died that day, for those who are still affected by the events, and that those who committed the attacks repent.

The need for prayer, both individually and as a community is a continued need. We need to pray for an end to war/violence in our own community (with the gun violence). We need to pray for those in war zones in Ukraine, Syria, Afghanistan, and places of armed conflict in Yemen, South Sudan, and Myanmar. We need to pray that they receive the gift of peace. We need to pray for all enduring religious persecution in Northern India, the Holy Land, Egypt, and China that they receive freedom.

Praying for peace is an ongoing need! Maybe the first place to start is to pray for peace in our own homes and with our families. As we start this year, let praying for peace be a priority in your daily prayers! May God bless you!
