## FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

How many times have I told myself, "God isn't fair!"? I think it's a common thought for all of us. God isn't fair if fair means we get what we deserve. In reality, God is more than fair. The Gospel passage from Matthew today (chapter 20, verses)



1-16), is about the generous landowner hiring people during all times of the day to work n his vineyard. He pays the workers the same wage, whether they were there at the start of the day or the last minute!

God is overwhelmingly generous to all of us! A common pit-fall is to believe God is being more generous to someone else and we are more deserving. Even if we are more deserving (only God knows that!), we will only make ourselves miserable by drawing comparisons. We will always find someone who appears better off than we are.

Instead of comparing ourselves with others in this way, perhaps we should focus on God's goodness to us. We should also trust that God is more than fair toward any of us. We certainly all have our share of challenges/problems, but we have much to be thankful for! The Eucharist, which we are about to receive, is a word that means "Thanksgiving"! It's good for us to see that, whenever we have come into the faith, we all receive the same daily wage! We all receive the fullness of Jesus – body, blood, soul, and divinity!
