FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

As we celebrate Black History Month, the story of St. Katharine Drexel can give us something to reflect on!

Mother Drexel was born in 1858 to a wealthy Catholic family. She was raised to have a relationship with Jesus through prayer and good works. The works were initially done at a distance.

She was inspired by the book, A Century of Dishonor by Helen Hunt Jackson. The book de-

scribes how people of Black people and Native Americans had been cruelly treated in the United States. She would spend time with the Dakotas to experience their struggles in person.

She had already become a Sister when she met with Pope Leo XIII. After describing her experiences with the Dakotas, the Pontiff encouraged her to be a missionary in the United

She would do just that! She would start a religious order, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. This community had an impact of the people she served, namely the native and African American communities.

St. Katharine was canonized in the year 2000. She is a wonderful example of reaching out and seeing communities in need. Fr. Josh Johnson in his book, On Earth as it is in Heaven, restoring God's vision of race and discipleship, he writes, "Once w have come to know the people in our community, we are invited to discern what resources we have in our toolboxes that best match their needs. I propose we limit our discernment of services to three areas: supernatural charisms, natural talents, and unearned privileges."

Fr. Johnson and St. Katharine Drexel are good examples for us to be aware of the needs and peoples in our community. I hope you have a blessed week.

Race Matters: Racism in Our Community Monday, February 12, 7:00-8:30 pm: Gang Life on Our Streets

Race Matters will welcome Michael Wilder and Yafinceio "Big B" Harris, members of the Group Violence Intervention Team. Big

B and Michael share personal histories of gang life and were once enemies on the street. After serving transformative prison terms, they co-founded Peace During War, an outreach program targeting at-risk youth in the Kalamazoo area.

They will talk about how racism was the impetus for the formation of gangs, their past involvement in gangs, how their group intervention began, and how they created a safe space at Urban Alliance for shooters and victims. A shooting victim will also be a member of the panel.


