FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The witness of the laity has always been extremely important in the Catholic Church. This is especially true for pointing out social injustices. The role of Harriet Thompson has been pointed out by Fr. Josh Johnson from his book, *On Earth as it is in Heaven: Restoring God's vision of Race and Discipleship*.



Harriet Thompson:
New York, October 29th, 1863

Fr. Johnson points out that Harriet Thompson was an uneducated Black woman who wrote a heart-felt letter to Pope Pius the IX in 1853 (pages 62-63). Describing the negativity and prejudice by the clergy toward Black Catholics in the city and county of New York, where she was living. Children were being denied a Catholic education because their presence would make "white children uncomfortable."

Fr. Johnson states that she concluded her letter ended with: "I hope, it is the will of God for the Black race to be saved, something will soon take place for the better."

It is mentioned in other articles that twenty-six people signed this letter. Her letter was so important that the Vatican archived it in the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples.

We can still learn from Harriet's words today as we continue to work for a deeper concern for all our brothers and sisters and an end to any social systems that hinder any people from an education because of race or creed.

Redlining was a discriminatory practice in which services and home loans were withheld from neighborhoods where a high percentage of residents were of racial and ethnic minorities.

Wonderful speakers from our community, historian Matt Smith from the Kalamazoo Public Library and Beth McCann, Executive Director of Kalamazoo Neighborhood Housing Services (KNHS), will address the history of redlining in Kalamazoo, its impact on the development of core neighborhoods, and how it perpetuates income inequality today. 

now through Palm Sunday, March 24**



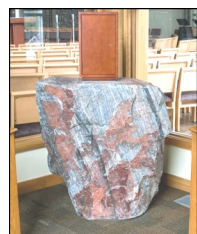
Do you have spare linens you can share? Both new and used sheets, blankets and towels are needed. The Aleman Center serves over 400 families each year, migrant workers who come to Michigan from the south to pick summer produce. Living conditions on the farms are sparse, and families arrive with few possessions, clothing, or household items. St. Tom's parishioners generously provide groceries, donated clothing, and volunteers to help every summer. One of the biggest needs often goes unmet because we do not receive enough donations of sheets and towels. You can help make a difference for these families. During Lent we will be collecting sheets and towels for families who need them this spring and summer. Donations may be placed in the box located near the toilet paper collection area. If possible, please label sheets with the size (we need all sizes).

Sheets, blankets and towels only, please; clothing and other household items will be collected during the summer.

Thanks so much for your willingness to help these families in need.

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

Abstinence from eating meat is to be observed by all those 14 and above on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays in Lent. On Fridays outside Lent, they may substitute another penitential act in place of abstinence. Fasting is required of those ages 18 to 60 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The USCCB has defined fasting in the United States as one full meal and two smaller meals not equaling another full meal together. Snacking is not permitted. (People may be excused from these practices for certain reasons, e.g. pregnant mothers.)



24/7 ACCESS TO ST. TOM'S BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL

The chapel can be accessed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by a personal access card that can be issued to interested parishioners. The coded card merely needs to be flashed within inches of the proximity reader and the chapel door will be electronically unlocked. Interested parishioners need to apply for their personal access card. The application will be reviewed by the Pastoral Team for approval. Please note: that if it is past open hours for the church, one would not have access to restrooms or public telephone. All prayers are encouraged to bring their own cell phones for emergency calling. As a security measure, there is a video camera in the chapel. The camera is not actively monitored by anyone, but a recording can be accessed the next day if anything is noticed amiss. Our Blessed Sacrament Chapel is a wonderful environment to share one's concerns, hopes and fears in the presence of our living Lord. A \$5.00 refundable deposit is required.
