FATHER PAUL'S POST

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel from John is a beautiful dialogue between Nicodemus and Jesus. Nicodemus was a Pharisee and a Jewish religious leader. This implies he is one of the 71 members of the San-

hedrin, the supreme ruling council of the Jewish people. Although Nicodemus was a teacher in Israel, he was completely puzzled in his dialogue with Jesus.

Jesus stresses that He has come to save us just because of God's great love, not because of any merit on our own part or that we deserve it. However, Jesus cautions us that His love cannot save us if we do not open ourselves to it. It is like the light. We can choose to open our eyes and hearts to His light or we can remain in the dark, the darkness of life without Christ.

We hear one of the most famous verses in the Gospel of John, 3:16: God so love the world, God so loved you and me, that He sent His only Son who died and rose to give us life. This is the new covenant that God offers us. We recall that love and express our faith in his love now as we come together and celebrate the Eucharist as a family. Have a blessed day!

Redlining and Generational Wealth

Redlining was a discriminatory practice in which services and home loans were withheld from neighborhoods where a high percentage of residents were of racial and ethnic minorities.

Wonderful speakers from our community, historian Matt Smith from the Kalamazoo Public Library and Beth McCann, Executive Director of Kalamazoo Neighborhood Housing Services (KNHS), will address the history of redlining in Kalamazoo, its impact on the development of core neighborhoods, and how it perpetuates income inequality today. The session will include presentations and Q & A.

24/7 ACCESS TO**ST. TOM'S BLESSED SACRAMENT CHAPEL**

The chapel can be accessed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by a personal access card that can be issued to interested parishioners. The coded card merely needs to be flashed within inches of the proximity reader and the chapel door will be electronically unlocked. Interested parishioners need to apply for their personal access card. The application will be reviewed by the Pastoral Team for approval. Please note: that if it is past open hours for the church, one would not have access to restrooms or public telephone. All prayers are encouraged to bring their own cell phones for emergency calling. As a security measure, there is a video



camera in the chapel. The camera is not actively monitored by anyone, but a recording can be accessed the next day if anything is noticed amiss. Our Blessed Sacrament Chapel is a wonderful environment to share one's concerns, hopes and fears in the presence of our living Lord. A \$5.00 refundable deposit is required.
