A POST FROM FR. PAUL

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

When the new church/worship space was completed in 2008, there were a few items that needed to be removed

because of budget constraints. One was having an exterior cross. That was added in 2021 with funds that had been specific for such a project. Before going ahead with this project, we showed the plans and asked the parishioners if this is something St. Tom's should have. The overall response was yes.

Another item that was not added was the Stations of the Cross. This was present in the previous worship space. Over the five years



that I have been here, this has been a topic of occasional conversation. Parishioners and visitors have occasionally asked if there are Stations of the Cross or is it possible to have them added to the main worship space.

This topic was consulted with the parish council, the finance council, and several members of the art committee. After inquiry and some basic research, it was recommended that such a project should go forward. It was recommended that a newly created artwork for the worship space be commissioned by an artist. All councils and the art committee recommended that a fund raiser needs to be established and no funds from the accounts at St. Thomas More be used.

The art committee involved in this exploratory stage believes that the Stations of the Cross could add to the worship experience without taking over the worship space. Artists commissioned would have a budget to work with and include in the design the charisms of the church.

The next stage in going forward with such a project is the consent of the general congregation here at St. Tom's! Do you believe having the Stations of the Cross would be of benefit to our congregation and to future congregations?

We would value your input. Please let us know if this is something that you believe should be supported.
