

A POST FROM FR. PAUL

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

This year we hear from the Gospel of Luke for Passion/Palm

Sunday. One aspect of Luke's perspective is that Luke stresses Jesus' innocence.

The Roman governor was the only person in Judea who could legally condemn anyone to death. During the time of Jesus,



that governor was Pontius Pilate. Pilate was noted for his cruelty. He was eventually removed from office by Rome because of his cruelty. He declared Jesus innocent in all four gospels. In Luke's gospel, Pilate declared Jesus innocent three separate times.

Another aspect in Luke is the emphasis of the forgiving nature of Jesus. Luke emphasizes the divine mercy of Jesus. Although we are not as innocent as Jesus was, we can still follow His example of forgiveness. We can work on mercy, healing and forgiveness rather than hatred and vengeance.

I would invite you to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus during this week. We all have suffering and problems in life in one way or another. We all have a cross to bear. Christ's sufferings can give us strength and hope. May God bless you all.



We would like to remind you, since we are not collecting EPS foam at St. Tom's, that the next scheduled foam collection will be SATURDAY APRIL 19, HOLY SATURDAY, 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM at Kalamazoo Valley Community College in Texas Township (6767 West O Avenue) and 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM SATURDAY, APRIL 26 at Mayor's Riverfront Park (251 Mills Street) and at At Mayor's Riverfront Park, there will also be electronics recycling and shredding.

At KVCC, there will be electronics recycling on that day.

Not all types of foam can be recycled in the Dart process. The material we are collecting is put through a process that grinds it up, melts it down and reforms it into new products. Due to the constraints of the machinery involved, we cannot collect packing peanuts of any composition, foam that does not bend, or foam that bends and does not break.

ACCEPTABLE:

(Test is when bent it breaks and often produces little foam balls)

Foam with the #6 symbol (chasing arrows)

Food containers that are clean -

volunteers and staff don't need to be handling filth

Foam boxes from med shipments

Foam from appliances etc.

Egg cartons

UNACCEPTABLE:

(Test is when it bends and doesn't break and when you bend it and it does not break)

Expanding Foam

Sheeted Styrofoam used for building

Straws and lids

Craft foam

Foam core for posters

Plastic bags

Paper bags

Trash

Soft foam in foldable sheets

Tape and stickers need to be removed
