

## IN HOPE ...... Jay Landry

Happy Easter! Let us thank God for our new Bishop of Rome, Pope Leo XIV.

In the second reading today from the Book of Revelation, we have the beautiful image of the New Jerusalem comina down out of heaven, settling on earth. God dwells fully with us in it. In its fullness,

there will be no tears, death, or pain. God says, "Behold, I make all things new."

For much of my life as a Catholic, my goal has been, that after I die, to go to heaven. If I live a holy enough life on earth, hopefully through God's mercy, I will be judged worthy to enter heaven. However, over time, I have come to see that Jesus calls us to another goal. Rather, Jesus calls us to build the Kinadom of heaven, the Kinadom of God, on earth today that grows into the New Jerusalem through the grace of God.

In John's Gospel today, Jesus combines the two commandments that we hear in Matthew, Mark, and Luke of loving God and loving our neighbor as we love ourselves into one: love one another as I have loved you.

Through following Jesus in the power of the Spirit, we can be transformed by God's unconditional love. In turn, we can transform our local world through seeking kinship with others. We do this by walking with and serving the grieving, hungry, homeless, refugees, and more.

This is the mission of the Church: to build the Kingdom of heaven, the New Jerusalem, today on earth, living as Jesus's hands and feet in joyful charity, working for God's justice that makes all things new.

And now, we have a US-born Bishop of Rome in Pope Leo XIV to lead us in this mission. Praise God!


## **REFUGEES SPEAK**




