Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we celebrate this Sixth Sunday of Easter, we also celebrate/remember Memorial Day. Please keep all those who served in the military in prayers, especially those who died in service for the country.

There is a common way of thinking about heaven. We may picture God deciding on who comes

into heaven and who doesn't! It is an image used throughout the Sacred Scriptures. It's an attempt to explain in a simple way that a life of virtue will lead eventually to happiness. A life of vices (bad habits) will eventually lead to unhappiness.

In reality, it's not God who decides who gets into heaven and who doesn't. That decision is made by each of us. That is the focus on today's gospel. Something has to take place in a person's life before they can "get into" heaven. Heaven has to "get into" them. Having God in us, living in us, animating us with His grace, loving us with His infinite love, uniting us through the Holy Spirit is what will constitute the glory of heaven.

Don't focus on who gets in or out of heaven. Focus instead on to what extent we are letting God "in" or keeping God "out" of our lives! Take care and have a blessed weekend.


REACH, STRETCH, RELAX
