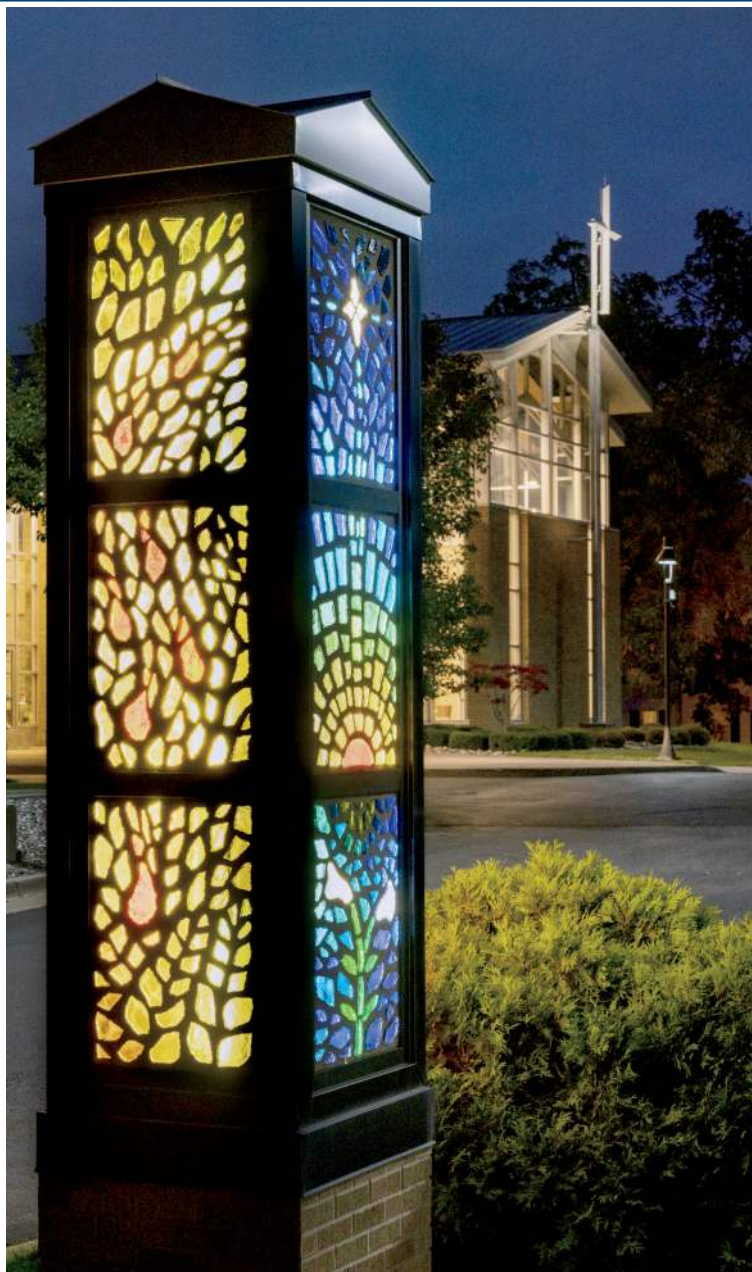

REFUGEE UPDATE

How can I explain what this refugee ministry means to me? It isn't just that we help our neighbors from Syria, Afghanistan, Democratic Republic of Congo, Bangladesh, and other places where people have fled their homes. Although that is a big part of it. Can you imagine what it feels like to come here not knowing the language or the customs or any people, and having to rely on strangers for nearly everything? WE, St. Tom's people, have provided companionship, friendly smiles, help finding furniture and household goods, rides to ESL classes and doctor appointments, even rides to work in some cases. We've donated needed supplies to at least 15 families every month, items they cannot buy with SNAP vouchers. We've become liaisons between parents and schools. We've offered help figuring out how to use the bus system, how to get library cards, how to prepare for a drivers test. Still, this is only part of it. The ministry is also for the people who donate time, energy, and goods. So many have expressed their gratitude for having a concrete way to help! For my part, I am able to focus on one thing I can do to make a change in a few people's lives. I can't solve all the problems I see and hear about all day long, but I CAN DO THIS! I have met some wonderful people in the refugee community and at St. Tom's! I have been constantly awed by the generosity of both these groups! When I think the refugee family has nothing, they offer incredible food! They offer to shovel my driveway! When I feel like I can't help enough, I get calls from people who have read something in the bulletin and want to help! Sewing machines! Beds! Even an artist's easel show up out of your generosity! This is a living example of the loaves and fishes parable! It's the answer to the question, "Who is my neighbor?" People with trucks offer to deliver large items. People moving to smaller homes offer their furniture. My garage looks like a department store, holding the donations that await a new home. Again, this is not all. We are giving joy, we are receiving joy, all in God's name!

NEW REQUEST FROM SAMARITAS:

A new refugee family of four just arrived from another state. They need two twin beds and mattresses, and a couch and chairs. Also they can use a tv, tv stand, nightstands, end tables, lamps, storage units, chests of drawers. Anything you can donate will be much appreciated!
