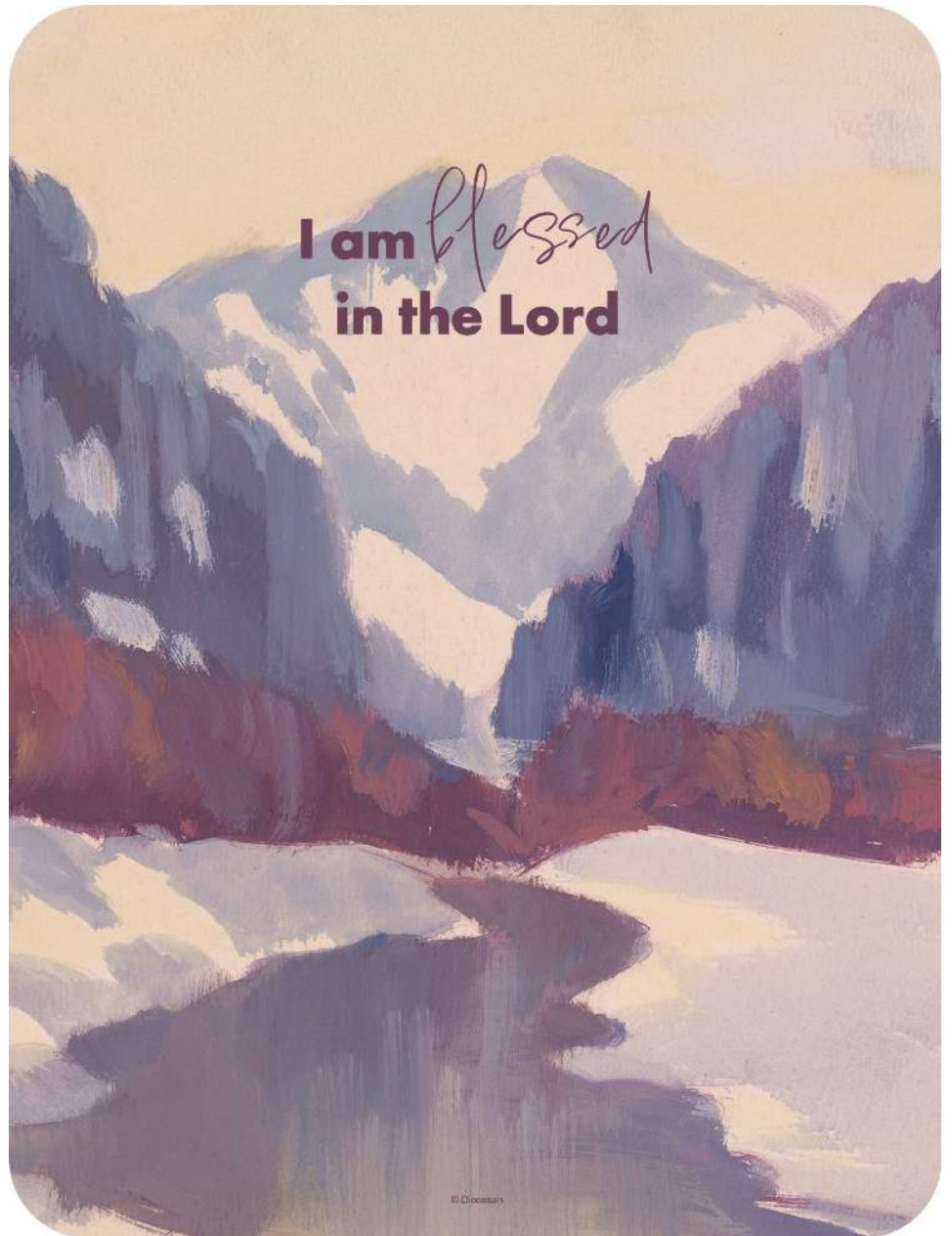

**A POST FROM FR. PAUL**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This week's Gospel is probably one of the most famous passages in the entire Bible! It's the Beatitudes. It's also known as the Sermon on the Mount. What we heard is the first part of the sermon. It goes on for three chapters!

Jesus is telling us that the road to true happiness begins here. All the Beatitudes begin with the word "blessed." The original Greek word is Makarios. This word means happy in an ordinary sense. It also means one is especially happy or favored, or fortunate. That is why it is mostly translated as "blessed."



It seems very contradictory, especially in our society. In St. Matthew's gospel, he makes them more spiritual than in the counterpart in the Gospel of Luke (The Sermon on the Plain). However, Matthew does have some challenging points. For example, "Blessed are you who mourn.... blessed are you who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness..." Does happiness come from suffering? Maybe. Sometimes, suffering has a way of purifying us of our selfishness. Selfish people are not happy people.

I believe that, ultimately, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes to give us hope. Jesus is telling us to look beyond our sufferings to the eternal happiness we will have if we remain faithful to him. We can't forget that God created us for happiness. This happiness does not come from the latest gadget or newest fashion. It's happiness that comes from buying into His wisdom!

## REFUGEE UPDATE ..... submitted by Elsie Romano

Welcoming everyone is part of the reason I love St. Tom's! Where else can a young Salvadoran student meet a newly arrived refugee woman from South Africa? In my house! While Valeria was sitting at my dining room table, a caseworker from Samaritas came to pick up some household items and rugs donated by parishioners at St. Tom's. With him was a woman who had just arrived, with only four days' notice, from her previous home in South Africa. They were able to converse, as each spoke English! Both were experiencing snow for the first time. Valeria had tried skiing, with borrowed winter gear. The South African woman asked if I had a winter coat to spare. I did, plus boots, a hat, a scarf, a couple of warm sweaters and thermal socks. "Welcome to Michigan!" I said. This was such an impromptu visit that I wonder now what sort of impression it will leave with both women. I know it left one with me, one of the kindness and compassion that St. Tom's is showing to newcomers all the time. Are you from Syria? You are welcome. Are you from Afghanistan? Venezuela? Pakistan? Congo? South Africa? Bangladesh? You are welcome. Are you a college student? A young family? Single? Married? Widowed? You are welcome. Black? Brown? White? You are welcome. We are a community. It shows. My understanding is that we may be receiving more refugees from South Africa in the near future. More refugees means more stuff! More opportunities to share our love!

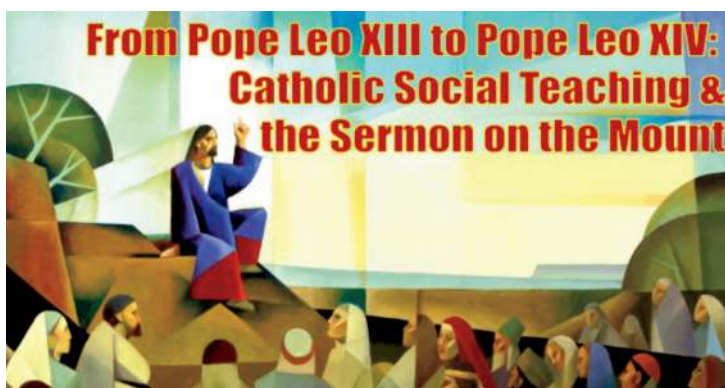

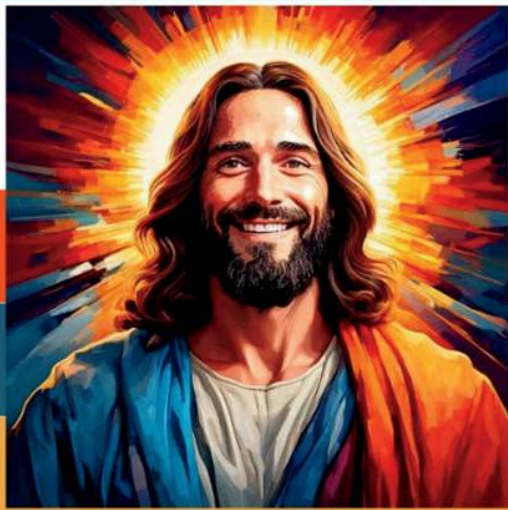
