

We pray that these restrictions will soon be lifted so that we priests can resume visiting the sick in our hospitals.

# Special "Collection" on Ash Wednesday

Due to the considerable annual costs of supporting our retired priests, Bishop McManus has announced that there will be a collection to be taken at each Mass on Ash Wednesday in all of our parishes. A collection has never been taken before on Ash Wednesday. The bishop did so after a broad consultation with finance experts, the Diocesan Finance Committee, the Presbyteral Council, pastors, laity, and a special ad hoc committee which worked to make specific recommendations on our annual fiscal challenges.

This collection will be taken this year and each year going forward. Ash Wednesday is February 17<sup>th</sup>. Offerings can be placed in the basket as parishioners enter the church (as we have been doing). We were able to contact the Waltz Envelope Company which supplies our parishioners with their monthly envelopes and they will include a special envelope for this purpose in the next monthly mailing (arriving at the end of January).

The cost of supporting our retired (50+) diocesan priests is millions of dollars each year. Some of those costs are supported by the Annual Partners in Charity Appeal, some by Forward in Faith funds from over twenty years ago, some by bequests that have been left, some by the annual budget support of all the parishes and some by special burses. But the shortfall often approaches a million dollars per year and in some years exceeds it. And recently the diocese has had to reduce the financial support given to these priests.

## Coming to Mass...

We've had a safe re-opening Mass experience for the past 36 weeks. We are regularly celebrating confessions, baptisms and other sacraments in addition to all our Masses. Persons who are ill should not come to Mass at this time. Family members may sit together in the same pew. With the exception of your own family members you must sit at least six feet apart from others. Social distancing is required. Every alternate pew is left empty. We've marked off those pews with tape. All people must wear a mask throughout the Mass with the *following exceptions*...(1) children under the age of 2 should not wear a mask; (2) parents will use their own discretion for those children between the age of 2 and 5 years old; (3) if a person has a medical or disabling condition they are not required to wear a mask.

# *'ASH WEDNESDAY'*WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 17th

We know it is still a few weeks away but in the spirit of preparing in advance these days (due to the pandemic) we wanted you to know some things about it, especially those things that will be different.

On Wednesday, February 17th, we'll celebrate **Ash Wednesday**, the first day of Lent. We will celebrate 6 Masses, spread throughout the day, enabling everyone to find the time to come to Mass, receive Ashes and begin the holy season of Lent. We will continue with our tradition of offering six Masses. While we have always had good size congregations for all these Ash Wednesday Masses, having six Masses makes more sense this year than ever before. It will spread out the congregational sizes that much more.

The Masses will be at 7:00 am, 9:00 am, 12:00 noon, 3:00 pm, 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm. Music will be offered at the last three Masses.

We have been informed as to the new (pandemic-related) manner for the distribution of ashes and describe it here: The priest will bless the ashes with a prayer and sprinkle the ashes with holy water in the customary fashion. Then he will address all those present and **only once say**, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." The priest (or priests) will then cleanse his hands, put on a face mask and distribute the ashes. Individual Q-tips will be used to apply ashes to each forehead without saying anything. After each individual use the Q-tip will be discarded.

As we have been doing with Communion we will distribute ashes on one side of the church at a time.

Tens of thousands of people are the beneficiaries of our charitable giving. Just a few examples are these: those living at the Nazareth Home for Boys - the care of about fifty retired priests - poor families served by Pernet Family Health Service - seniors receiving home health care - children seeking a good education - those preparing for the priesthood or diaconate - and the developmentally disabled at Mercy Centre. But there is much more!

Hopefully, you will consider making a gift from your generosity and spirit of sacrifice. Our parish goal is \$110,700. The Diocese must raise \$5 million this year and that will take a lot of us pitching in to achieve it! Last year, while Christ the King exceeded its goal, the Diocese was several hundred thousand dollars short of its goal, largely because of the pandemic.

Most of our most faithful parishioners have not been able to return to Mass so I've written a letter to everyone. We will not be able to have an in-pew appeal as we have in the past. What is not conducive to hygienic best practices just now is the common touching of pens, envelopes, collection baskets, etc. Our appeal will largely be through the mail. If you plan on sending a **check** it should be made **payable** to *Partners in Charity*. You can also donate **online** by going to **partners-charity.net/donate**.
