BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM

All parents must participate in a team-led preparation session if this is their first child and/or if they do not worship at Sunday Masses. Parents whose children are not vet born may participate in the program if they like. It takes place in the rectory on select Sunday afternoons from 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm. The dates for the next three sessions are Sundays: in 2022: today, October 9 and November 20; and in 2023 (thus far) on January 8. Please call Monsignor Sullivan (508-754-5361) to preregister for the program. Later dates for these sessions will be posted in 2023. Actual baptisms take place on select Sundays at the 11:00 am Mass. Parents work with Msgr. Sullivan to establish an appropriate date. The next scheduled public celebrations of infant Baptism at Mass will take place on the following Sundays: in 2022 ~ November 6 and December 11. Dates for baptisms in 2023 are: January 15, February 19, April 16, May 21, and June 18.

Since so many people still work on Columbus Day, (tomorrow) Monday, October 10, our daily Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 am that day.

Low Gluten Hosts Available for Holy Communion

We've been offering 'low-gluten' hosts for those who cannot tolerate gluten. These hosts meet the requirements of the Catholic Church for Holy Communion in terms of ingredients and gluten content. The hosts we use have gluten content of less than 0.01%. Speak to Msgr. Sullivan prior to Mass so that we can offer this special host to you.

NEED 'ADULT CONFIRMATION?'

Were you baptized and received Holy Communion but never confirmed? Do you want to be able to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor? If any are interested, our parish has preparation sessions each year for those adults who were never confirmed. The program is for adults who were baptized and received First Holy Eucharist (Communion) but never completed their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Msgr. Sullivan conducts the 6-session program on Thursday evenings (November 10 & 17; December 1 & 15; January 12 & 19) from 7:15 to 8:15 pm. The Confirmation ceremony takes place at St. Paul's Cathedral in early February, when Bishop McManus celebrates the sacrament for adults from throughout the diocese. Here's how they work: You purchase food or gift cards in various amounts of \$10 to \$100; You use the food cards for your shopping; You receive the full-face value of the card you purchase; What you don't spend remains on your card for later use; The supermarket or store donates 5% to 10% of what you spend to prevent family homelessness. Since opening many years ago the staff has welcomed hundreds of mothers and their babies. While women await the birth of their babies Visitation House feeds, clothes, educates and nurtures them. After the birth of their baby, mothers can stay up to six months and are assisted with housing, higher education, job opportunities and necessities to start their new lives. It costs well over \$3,000 per month (for each mother and baby) and the house can accommodate 12 moms and infants at a time. How to Put 'The Priest Retirement Fund' in Your Will

After providing for your family and loved ones, you may wish to put *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund* in your will, thus assuring the care of our 50 retired priests. Bequests are free of estate tax and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give needed support for *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund* by simply including the following words in your will: "I give, devise, and bequeath to *The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund*, 49 Elm Street, Worcester, MA 01609 (insert amount being given here) to be used to support our retired diocesan priests." A bequest can be a specific dollar amount, a specific piece of property, a percentage of an estate, or all or part of the residue of an estate. You can also name *The Diocese of Worcester* as a contingency beneficiary in the event someone named in your will is no longer living. It is recommended that an attorney help in drafting or amending a will.

Why Come to Sunday Mass?

The American Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, when conducting a retreat for teens, once gave a talk on the meaning of the Mass. He said, "If you don't get anything out of Mass, it's because you don't bring the right expectations to it." It is not entertainment. It is worship of the God who made us and saves us, an opportunity to praise and thank God for all that God has done for us. If we have a correct understanding of Mass it becomes more meaningful for us. We'll want to go to Mass. We'll understand why the Mass is God's precious gift to us, and we wouldn't think of refusing that gift. Here are some reasons to go to Mass:

The third of the Ten Commandments given to Moses by God is, "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day." The Mass was instituted at the Last Supper by Jesus. He said, "Do this in memory of me." When we participate in the Mass we remember his great act of love for us on the Cross so that we can live with him forever in heaven.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that Mass attendance on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is the first of the six Commandments of the Church. These commandments also require receiving Communion at least once a year during the Easter season, confessing any mortal sin as a preparation for Communion, and observing the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence. The Mass is the perfect sacrifice created by Jesus. Through the priest we offer Jesus, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, to the Father, just as Jesus offered Himself to the Father on the Cross.

Jesus said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." Receiving Holy Communion strengthens our union with Jesus. He lives within us in a special way. The Mass increases our love of God and neighbor. God wants us to come together in community to worship Him. Jesus said, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in your midst."

God will help us experience the tremendous benefits of the Mass. Bring an attitude of prayer and thanksgiving to Mass, and you will reap great spiritual riches: consolation, confidence, happiness, and spiritual strength for the challenges of life.
