

Annual Mission Coop Appeal Here on July 22-23

Every diocesan parish participates in the Annual Mission Cooperative Appeal each year. This is a special collection to assist the works of the Church in the mission lands and/or poor countries. On July 22-23 we are conducting this appeal and we will host the priest who will speak on the needs of his Diocese (Imphal) in northeast India. He is **Father Paul Ngaoni**. That Diocese is home to 34 tribes of Mongolian origin. The first Catholic baptism was recorded in 1952. They have 45 parishes, 8 Mission Centers, 174 priests (including 114 indigenous tribal priests). The growth of the Church has been accompanied by various persecutions. Between 1990-2001, six young missionaries were killed for witnessing the Gospel.

This past May the area saw unprecedented violence towards the Christian minority. Over 200 tribals were killed. 50,000 Christians have fled their villages as their homes were destroyed. They have taken refuge in military camps and Catholic schools. Churches have been burned down. It will take years to rebuild the damaged churches and institutions (millions of dollars) and to alleviate sufferings of its tribal communities through massive relief and rehabilitation program. Thank you in advance for whatever relief you can give in this appeal.

HOSPITAL VISITS UPDATE

The priest chaplains at our hospitals continue to serve the pastoral needs of their patients. Please let us know if someone you know is hospitalized and Msgr. Sullivan will be happy to visit that person. The best thing is for a family member or friend to call the rectory to let us know your loved one is in the hospital. St. Vincent's Hospital has recently had technical issues with their new computer system and cannot provide any information. We can never get any information from either UMass Hospital (at the Lake) or Memorial Hospital, members of the same institution. Therefore you must call the rectory.

The 12th Annual Novena to St. Joseph Begins September 11th

Coming this fall will be the Novena to St. Joseph on Monday nights. It's hard to believe that this will be the twelfth anniversary year. We will pray for the sick, pray for improvements in palliative care, and pray to oppose all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide. The Novena will be celebrated for nine consecutive Mondays from 7:15 pm to 8:00 pm. The schedule of homilists are Sept. 11, Rev. Stephen M. Gemme; Sept. 18, Most Rev. Robert J. McManus; Sept. 25, Rev. Msgr. James P. Moroney; Oct. 2, Rev. Paul J. Shaughnessy, SJ; Oct. 9, Rev. John J. Gavin, SJ; Oct. 16, Rev. Robert A. Grattaroti; Oct. 23, Rev. Richard W. Polek; Oct. 30, Rev. Enoch Kvermateng; and Nov. 6, Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. Sullivan. We hope that you will participate in this important annual event as the pressure increases on the state legislature to make physician assisted suicide the law in Massachusetts.

THINKING ABOUT BECOMING CATHOLIC?

The Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation are known as the *Sacraments of Initiation*. A Catholic is not fully initiated into the life of the Catholic Church until he or she has received all three of these sacraments. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the process of spiritual and educational formation by which adults become full members of the Catholic Church. The process welcomes both people who have never been baptized and people who were baptized in another Christian tradition and now wish to become Catholic. There is the expectation that candidates will attend Mass each Sunday as well as the formation sessions which will be offered.
