

Christmas 2023 Masses

As we have been announcing since September, this year, Christmas Eve, December 24, falls on a Sunday. It is a Sunday divided into two liturgical seasons. In the morning is the 4th Sunday of Advent. The afternoon is Christmas Eve when vigil Masses are offered. If we observed our normal Christmas Eve schedule this would mean we'd celebrate six Masses that day. So, this year we are discontinuing our late-night Mass on Christmas Eve. The size of the congregation at that Mass has been very small the past few years. On Sunday, December 24, we will have our 3 morning Advent Masses, the regular Sunday schedule. Christmas Eve Masses will be celebrated at 4:00 pm (the Festival Choir will sing) and 6:00 pm (the Folk Group will sing). On Monday, December 25, Christmas Day morning, Masses will be celebrated at 8:00 am and 10:00 am. We thank you for your understanding.

A Good Decision by the American Medical Association

This past November 12 the American Medical Association voted to sustain its current ethical opposition to physician assisted suicide! Its position remains: "Physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would pose serious societal risks." The House of Delegates entertained two attempts to change their strong ethical stance. One resolution called for the AMA to "go neutral" on the matter. The other called for it to support physician assisted suicide. Both were voted down.

Moreover, the AMA continues to stand by its deeply studied and reviewed decision by its Council of Ethical and Judicial Affairs, that the term "assisted suicide" be the preferred terminology rather than sanitized expressions like "medical aid in dying," or "death with dignity," etc., that have become preferred by advocates. For the fourth time now, the AMA has re-affirmed its opposition to physician assisted suicide, even though it is legally permitted in 11 jurisdictions in the U.S., two of which (Vermont and Oregon) have waived any residency requirements, effectively making assisted suicide now available to any U.S. citizen. This position reminds us that just **because something is legal does not make it ethical**. The profession of medicine continues to profess its ethos, which it has been developing and refining through thoughtful scholarship and practice for over two thousand years.

HOSPITAL VISITS UPDATE

The priest chaplains at our hospitals continue to serve the pastoral needs of their patients. Please let us know if someone you know is hospitalized and Msgr. Sullivan will be happy to visit that person. The best thing is for a family member or friend to call the rectory to let us know your loved one is in the hospital. St. Vincent's Hospital's new computer system cannot provide any information. For many years we have not been able to obtain any information from either UMass Hospital (at the Lake) or Memorial Hospital about patients listed by their parishes. Therefore, you must call the rectory if you would like Msgr. Sullivan to visit a loved one.

Extra Weekday Masses in Advent - 5:30 pm

A wonderful spiritual preparation for Christmas is participation in a daily Mass during Advent. As has been our custom for many years our parish has an afternoon Mass at 5:30 pm, Monday through Friday during the Advent season. Of course, we continue to offer our 7:00 am Mass (Saturdays at 8:00 am). All are welcome to join us. The last of these Masses is on Friday, December 22. Mass concludes by 6:00 pm each night.

Many Thanks for Your Generosity in Our Charitable Endeavors

The parishioners of Christ the King have been extraordinarily generous in giving to the less fortunate. This is a good season to thank you for your concern for others. Even though some of these endeavors have been organized by specific parish groups it is to the much broader group of parishioners to whom we especially owe our thanks. We could not initiate these charitable efforts without the donations of so many active parishioners and donors. God bless you.

Baby Bottle Drive - We received a recent letter of thanks from Rebecca Urban of Visitation House. She wrote to thank us for the \$5,186 that CTK parishioners donated, spearheaded by our Women's Guild. The House serves young mothers and children and relies entirely on the donations of parish fundraisers like ours. St. Joan of Arc Parish, Worcester - Father Enoch Kyeremateng wrote to thank us for our \$10,000 gift (from CTK parish savings) so that the church and rectory could be heated by a new gas burner. Without this gift they would not have heat this winter. He called our gift "huge." Immaculate Conception Parish, Les Anglais, Haiti - We receive regular emails expressing the thanks of Father Pierre Gérard Sincère, pastor, for our continuing support there. Since the earthquake of 2021 we have donated \$160,000 (from Legacy of Hope funds and parish savings) for the rebuilding of the school (Notre Dame du Lourdes). We also pay the salaries of the teaching staff. Coats for Kids - This program, made possible by the generosity of our parishioners, recently distributed 276 winter coats to needy children through a variety of local social service agencies. Knights of Columbus Council members distributed the coats. Diaper Drive - Thousands of diapers will be distributed by Catholic Charities to needy mothers in the year ahead through our contribution of \$6.400. We are the only parish that does this. Giving Tree - All our gift tags were taken 2 weeks ago. Upwards of 100 needy children will receive gifts for Christmas from our parishioners. Mustard Seed - Our wonderful team of volunteers cook and serve meals for the homeless on the last Wednesday of each month (food purchased by our parish). They serve meals for one hundred fifty hungry persons. In the Hour of Need Family Shelter - This program on June Street serves homeless families. They are sustained by our annual pledged gifts, gift card contributions and meal prep, and by our two weeks of onsite volunteer commitment. Thanksgiving Mass Food Drive - We were able to fill a truck with donated canned foods and gave \$533 for the food pantry at Our Lady of Providence Parish, Worcester.
