COMING THIS FALL

Introducing the Roman Catholic Faith

A 15-session program to be held on Tuesday evenings this fall and early winter, this program will introduce learners to all the major beliefs held by the Roman Catholic Church. It is designed especially for those inquirers unfamiliar with the belief of Catholics and/or who may be considering receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at Easter (April 19, 2025) or later. However, all interested parties can join in, especially if they would like a "refresher." The program will be held in the Johnson Room, from 7:15 to 8:30 pm, on the following Tuesdays: September 17 & 24; October 1, 8, 15, 22 & 29; November 5, 12 & 19; December 3, 10 &17; January 6 & 14. Thereafter, from mid-January through Lent those wishing to pursue joining the Church will be offered the support customarily offered to "catechumens." There is no cost to participate. 13th Annual Novena to St. Joseph Begins September 9

Please join us for this fall's Novena to St. Joseph. We hope that you will participate in this important annual event as the pressure increases on the state legislature to make physician assisted suicide the law in Massachusetts. The Novena will be celebrated for nine consecutive Mondays from 7:15 pm to 8:00 pm. We pray for the sick, pray for improvements in palliative care, and pray to oppose all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide. ANNUAL PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of June 30 our diocese will participate in the global **Peter's Pence Collection**. This annual collection provides essential support for the Holy See's activities and helps Pope Francis assist the victims of wars, oppression, and natural disaster around the world. The collection has ancient roots that reach back to apostolic times. The early Christians provided material support so that the apostles - those preaching the Gospel - could distribute to those in need (see Acts 4:34-35, 11:29).

Today, the Peter's Pence Collection is an opportunity for the Church around the world to stand in solidarity with those in need. For example, migrants and refugees from southwestern and southern Asian countries - such as Syria, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Bangladesh - travel to Europe by the Balkan route, which runs through southeastern Europe. Since 2018, migrants traveling this way have ended their journeys in refugee camps. Late in 2020, a fire in one camp in Lipa, Bosnia-Herzegovina, forced 1,500 of these refugees to live outdoors during the cold and snow of winter. Pope Francis responded with a donation to build structures to accommodate the refugee families and unaccompanied minors.

Your contribution to Peter's Pence helps fund not only all the activities of the dicasteries of the Roman Curia that assist the pope in his ministry, but also several solidarity projects that aid those most in need. 
