

#### Last Weekend's 'Pew Count'

Last weekend all the parishes in the Diocese of Worcester conducted the annual 'Diocesan Pew Count.' This is an exercise to assist with overall pastoral planning for the Diocese. At Christ the King our attendance at Mass on October 19 & 20 was as follows: 4:00 pm, 162 (last year 129); 7:30 am, 96 (last year 106); 9:00 am, 142 (last year 150); and 11:00 am, 198 (last year 169). The total number of people who came to Mass here last weekend was 598, or 32% of the parish community. There are 1,941 registered men, women and children in the parish (791 registered families). And here are the numbers for the Diocesan Pew Count at Christ the King for the last thirteen years: 2023 (554); 2022 (536); 2021 (477); 2020 (458); 2019 (813); 2018 (815); 2017 (934); 2016 (690); 2015 (805); 2014 (918); 2013 (927); 2012 (837) and 2011 (848).

#### Novena to St. Joseph Continues Tomorrow Night With Father James Boulette

Our 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Novena to St. Joseph continues tomorrow, Monday, October 28, at 7:15 pm. Each evening lasts just 45 minutes and concludes with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Father Boulette will offer the homily. He is the pastor of St. Roch Parish in Oxford. His parents are members of Christ the King. The Novena includes prayer for the seriously ill, for improvements in palliative care, and to raise awareness about all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide or euthanasia. Ron Williams and Olga Rogach will collaborate to present beautiful arrangements of many of the African American spirituals sung by slaves prior to their emancipation. You will hear their story through music and narration. In addition, Olga will present solo piano works of 20th century Black women composers including Florence Price, Margaret Bonds and Betty Jackson King. Ron is a renowned singer, lecturer, and vocal instructor. He has achieved national recognition for his outstanding work with opera companies including the San Francisco Spring Opera, Detroit Opera, Opera San José, and the Boston Lyric Opera. He has been the bass soloist for a production of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony at Boston's Hatch Shell. Olga, a pianist, performs extensively in New England and is acclaimed for her recitals and collaborations with instrumentalists and vocalists. She received a Master of Music degree in piano performance from Russia's famed St. Petersburg Conservatory and became a faculty member. She emigrated to the U.S. in 1991 and made Worcester her home. A leading regional piano teacher she also offers private instruction to students at Worcester's Polytechnic Institute. A reception will follow in the Johnson Room.

### 'ALL SAINTS DAY' ~ THIS FRIDAY

The Church will honor all the holy men and women who have gone before us, the famous and the not so famous all those who have been canonized and beatified and who are venerated throughout the world, and those who have not achieved such acclaim and never will, those we have known and lived with and loved. That combination makes this a wonderful feast. One of the great teachings of the Church is that of "the communion of saints" - that mystery that connects the dead with the living - they praying for us, we praying to them - reinforcing that we are not alone - that we have wonderful friends who, throughout eternity, are helping us.

A great French novelist died in 1970. He was Francois Mauriac and once said it this way: "We are all molded and remolded by those who have loved us, and though that love may pass, we remain, none the less, their work. No love, no friendship can ever cross the path of our destiny without leaving some mark upon it forever." Well, the saints have loved us and left their mark on us. In this celebration, the Church reminds us that heaven is our destiny, our eternal home. It reminds us that all of us are called to holiness. Unfortunately, some feel that the saint is to be a "goody two-shoes" or someone not living in the real world. Nothing could be further from the truth. The saints were not weak but the strongest among us. Our vocation is to become like those heroic individuals who have gone before us who live the Christian life at the level of "sublime extravagance." Sublime: showing a moral beauty at its highest degree ~ Extravagance: where the indwelling of God in us is so powerful that it produces extraordinary effects. Sanctity, holiness, the vocation of us all, is a love of God and others so wonderful that it defies ordinary human understanding.


