

# 'HOPE FOR HOUSING' CARDS

# KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS' Annual Diaper Drive

In recent years our Knights of Columbus Council has worked with Catholic Charities to make this drive very successful. It serves the needs of untold numbers of poor mothers in Worcester County. Catholic Charities has established a program where they will purchase diapers at a low, wholesale price. State benefit programs do not pay for diapers. Most licensed day care providers require that babies be in disposable diapers (sometimes up to 12 a day). The typical monthly cost for poor mothers is about \$80+ per month per child. This is difficult for many struggling families in our area. We hope to raise \$5,000 to assist Catholic Charities in their hope of purchasing and distributing tens of thousands of diapers in the year ahead. We hope you can help us. # **Every Life is Sacred**

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, the value of human life is being threatened by the harsh treatment of so many minority groups and the disabled as well as through physician assisted suicide, cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

Just as the commandment "Thou shalt not kill" sets a clear limit to safeguard the value of human life, today we also have to say "thou shalt not" to an economy of exclusion and inequality. Such an economy kills. How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure, but it is news when the stock market loses two points?

The basis for all that the Church believes about the moral dimensions of economic life is its vision of the transcendent worth, the sacredness, of human beings. The dignity of the human person, realized in community with others, is the criterion against which all aspects of economic life must be measured.

There exist sinful inequalities that affect millions of men and women. These are in open contradiction of the Gospel. The equal dignity of all persons demands that we strive for fairer and more humane conditions. Excessive economic and social disparity between individuals and peoples of the one human race is a source of scandal and militates against social justice, equity, human dignity, as well as social and international peace.


