

# **LENT BEGINS ON MARCH 5!**

The holy season of Lent will soon begin. Ash Wednesday is March 5, a late Lenten season this year (which means a later Easter, April 20). Hopefully, the entire parish community will participate in Mass on Ash Wednesday as we initiate, once more, this season of penance and preparation for the great mystery of the Lord's Resurrection on Easter. As always, there will be six Masses offered on Ash Wednesday, each one with the imposition of ashes. The Mass times will be: 7:00 am, 9:00 am, 12:00 noon, 3:00 pm, 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm. It is our earnest hope that you will be able to attend one of the Masses. And please bring your school-age and younger children. It is our hope that we will see all our parishioners often during Lent and then for Holy Week and Easter.

Please remember that we will have an additional weekday Mass (Monday-Friday) during this season at 5:30 pm. And there will be additional times for confessions - each Lenten Tuesday evening from 7:00 to 8:00 pm. The Stations of the Cross will be offered each Lenten Friday afternoon from 3:00 to 3:30 pm.

For many years Monsignor Sullivan has been a notary public. Should any parishioner need to have a document notarized you are welcome to call upon him. There will be no fee for any notarizations. He is simply happy to assist you. Just call the rectory should you need this service.

# How to Put 'The Priest Retirement Fund' in Your Will

After providing for your family and loved ones, you may wish to put The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund in your will, thus assuring the care of our 54 retired priests. Bequests are free of estate tax and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give needed support for The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund by simply including the following words in your will: "I give, devise, and bequeath to The Diocesan Priest Retirement Fund, 49 Elm Street, Worcester, MA 01609 (insert amount being given here) to be used to support our retired diocesan priests." A bequest can be a specific dollar amount, a specific piece of property, a percentage of an estate, or all or part of the residue of an estate. You can also name The Diocese of Worcester as a contingency beneficiary in the event someone named in your will is no longer living. It is recommended that an attorney help in drafting or amending a will.
