

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM For this Summer

All parents must participate in a preparation session if this is their first child and/or if they do not worship at Sunday Masses. Parents whose children are not yet born may participate in the program if they like. Please call Monsignor Sullivan (508-754-5361) or email him (tsullivan5@mac.com) to schedule a time to meet. Sometimes baptisms are celebrated privately (not at a public Mass). During this summer it is likely that baptisms will be scheduled individually and apart from Mass. Parents work with Msgr. Sullivan to establish an appropriate date for the actual baptism.

14th Annual Novena to St. Joseph Begins September 8 Homilists Announced

Please join us for this fall's Novena to St. Joseph. We hope that you will participate in this important annual event as the pressure increases on the state legislature to make physician assisted suicide the law in Massachusetts. The Legislature of the State of New York just passed this legislation. The Novena will be celebrated for nine consecutive Mondays from 7:15 pm to 8:00 pm. We pray for the sick, pray for improvements in palliative care, and pray to oppose all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide. The schedule of homilists is Sept. 8, Bishop Robert J. McManus; Sept. 15, Father Donato Infante; Sept. 22, Father José Carvajal; Sept. 29, Father Derek Mobilio; Oct. 6, Father John Larochelle; Oct. 13, Father John Gavin, SJ; Oct. 20, Father Robert Grattaroti; Oct. 27, Father Lucas Laroche; and Nov. 3, Msgr. Sullivan. In August the names of those people who are terminally or critically ill, and who will be prayed for during the Novena, can be mailed to our rectory office, or called in to 508-754-5361, or emailed to Msgr. Sullivan at tsullivan5@mac.com.

Do You Need to be Confirmed as an Adult?

Were you baptized and received Holy Communion but were never confirmed? Do you want to be able to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor? If any are interested, our parish has preparation sessions each year for those adults who were never confirmed. The program is for adults who were baptized and received First Holy Eucharist (Holy Communion) but never completed their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Msgr. Sullivan conducts the 5-session program on Thursday evenings (October 30; November 13; December 4 & 18; and January 8) from 7:00 to 8:15 pm. An optional retreat (Sunday afternoon into the early evening) is given for people from throughout the Diocese. Last year it was here at Christ the King. The Confirmation ceremony takes place at St. Paul's Cathedral on a Sunday afternoon in mid-winter or perhaps this year in early spring (we have not been told yet). Bishop McManus celebrates this final Sacrament of Initiation for adults from throughout the diocese. Adult candidates for Confirmation should be already going to Sunday Mass. Obviously, a candidate does not have to be married but if they are married it must in the Catholic Church. We can assist with that. If you are interested, please contact Msgr. ANNUAL DEACON JOE BANIUKIEWICZ 'COATS FOR KIDS' APPEAL NEXT WEEKEND

As a father, Knight of Columbus and long serving Deacon, Joe Baniukiewicz started this project several years ago to provide warmth for children in need during the cold winter months. His goal was to ensure that no child in our area goes without a coat during the winter season. Next weekend, KofC Council (#12691) members will conduct this annual appeal after all our Masses. We know it is unusual to think about winter coats during the heat of August but the Knights' leadership at Supreme Headquarters in New Haven has a need for earlier orders for the winter coats in recent years.

Nationally, 'Coats for Kids' was begun by the Knights of Columbus in 2009 to ensure that all children in colder climates have a winter coat. Our local CTK Council began this endeavor in 2016. Our Council has distributed hundreds of winter coats to local children, the largest amount of any Council in Central Massachusetts. The coats have been distributed for children at the following sites: Our Lady of Providence Parish, Pernet Family Health Service, St. Joan of Arc Parish, Friendly House, Worcester Boys and Girls Club, The IHN Family Shelter, St. Paul's Cathedral, Dr. Arthur F. Sullivan Middle School, Catholic Charities and Webster Public Schools.
