

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM

All parents must participate in a preparation session if this is their first child and/or if they do not worship at Sunday Masses. Scheduled times for the Parent Planning meetings for this fall are on Sundays from 1:00 to 2:30 pm on the following Sundays: September 14 and November 2. For 2026 they are the following Sundays: January 4; March 1; April 19; and June 14. Most baptisms occur on occasional Sunday mornings at the 11:00 am Mass since Baptism is a public celebration. The dates for these baptismal celebrations for the year ahead are: September 28; October 19; November 30; December 28; February 1; March 1; April 12; May 10; and June 14.

Do You Need to be Confirmed as an Adult?

Were you baptized and received Holy Communion but were never confirmed? Do you want to be able to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor? If any are interested, our parish has preparation sessions each year for those adults who were never confirmed. The program is for adults who were baptized and received First Holy Eucharist (Holy Communion) but never completed their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Msgr. Sullivan conducts the 5-session program on Thursday evenings (October 30; November 13; December 4 & 18; and January 8) from 7:00 to 8:15 pm. An optional retreat (Sunday afternoon into the early evening) is given for people from throughout the Diocese. Last year it was here at Christ the King. The Confirmation ceremony takes place at St. Paul's Cathedral on a Sunday afternoon in mid-winter or perhaps this year in early spring (we have not been told yet). Bishop McManus celebrates this final Sacrament of Initiation for adults from throughout the diocese. Adult candidates for Confirmation should be already going to Sunday Mass. Obviously, a candidate does not have to be married but if they are married it must in the Catholic Church. We can assist with that. If you are interested, please contact Msgr. 14th Annual Novena to St. Joseph Begins September 8 We Hope You Will Come This Year!

Please join us for this fall's Novena to St. Joseph. We hope that you will participate in this important annual event as the pressure increases on the state legislature to make physician assisted suicide the law in Massachusetts. The Legislature New York State passed this legislation, and it may soon be signed into law by Governor Hochul. The Novena will be celebrated for nine consecutive Mondays from 7:15 pm to 8:00 pm. We pray for the sick, pray for improvements in palliative care, and pray to oppose all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide. The schedule of homilists is Sept. 8, Bishop Robert J. McManus; Sept. 15, Father Donato Infante; Sept. 22, Father José Carvajal; Sept. 29, Father Derek Mobilio; Oct. 6, Father John Larochelle; Oct. 13, Father John Gavin, SJ; Oct. 20, Father Robert Grattaroti; Oct. 27, Father Lucas Laroche; and Nov. 3, Msgr. Sullivan. The names of those people who are terminally or critically ill, and who will be prayed for during the Novena, can now be mailed to our rectory office, or called in to 508-754-5361, or emailed to Msgr.
