

Adult Confirmation Program Starts October 30

Were you baptized and received Holy Communion but were never confirmed? Do you want to be able to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor? If any are interested, our parish has preparation sessions each year for those adults who were never confirmed. The program is for adults who were baptized and received First Holy Eucharist (Holy Communion) but never completed their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Msgr. Sullivan conducts the 5-session program on Thursday evenings in the parish rectory (October 30; November 13; December 4 & 18; and January 8) from 7:00 to 8:15 pm. A retreat for candidates from throughout the Diocese will take place here at Christ the King from 2:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Sunday, January 18. The Confirmation ceremony will take place at 3:00 pm on Sunday, February 15, 2026, at St. Paul's Cathedral. Bishop McManus celebrates this final Sacrament of Initiation for adults from throughout the diocese. Adult candidates for Confirmation should be already going to Sunday Mass. Obviously, a candidate does not have to be married but if they are married it must in the Catholic Church. We can assist with that. If you are interested, please contact Msgr. Annual Novena to St. Joseph Continues Tomorrow, October 20

We Hope All Will Come!

Father Robert Grattaroti, the pastor of St. Joseph Parish in Charlton, will be the homilist for our Novena to St. Joseph at tomorrow evening's service. Please come and join us for the event. We hope all will participate in this important annual event as the pressure increases on the state legislature to make physician assisted suicide the law in Massachusetts. The Novena is celebrated from 7:15 pm to 8:00 pm. We pray for the sick, pray for improvements in palliative care, and pray to oppose all attempts to end human life unnaturally as in the case of physician assisted suicide. Pope Leo's *Dilexi te*Faith leads to love for the poor

On October 4, Pope Leo XIV issued his first Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi te*, as a call to Christ's disciples "to recognize him in the poor and the suffering." Although 40 pages, we recommend reading it. It can be found easily on the internet.

The document sees the love of Christ incarnated in love for the poor, in caring for the sick, opposing slavery, defending women who experience exclusion and violence, making education available to all, accompanying migrants, charitable giving, working for equality and more. *Dilexi te* ("I have loved you," from Rev 3:9) flows directly from the Gospel of the Son of God, Who in the very act of entering our world through the Incarnation became poor for our sake. It reflects the Church's social teaching as "a veritable treasury of significant teachings" concerning the poor.

With this document, Pope Leo situates himself firmly on the path laid out by his predecessors, including Pope Saint John XXIII, with his appeal, in *Mater et Magistra*, to wealthier countries not to remain indifferent to nations oppressed by hunger and extreme poverty. Pope Saint Paul VI added his own voice with *Populorum progressio* as an advocate of the poor; as did Pope Saint John Paul II, who consolidated the doctrinal foundations of the Church's "preferential option for the poor." More recently, Pope Benedict XVI, in *Caritas in veritate*, offered a more markedly political take on the crises of our times while Pope Francis made care for the poor and solidarity with the poor one of the key themes of his pontificate.

Upcoming Holy Days All Saints & All Souls

We celebrate two important feast days on the weekend of **November 1** and **2**. On Saturday, November 1st, we celebrate the **Solemnity of All Saints**. The lives of all the saints are celebrated, not just those we know as being canonized. When a solemnity like this is celebrated on a Saturday, however, there is no obligation to attend Mass as there would be on other weekdays. So, **our only** All Saints **Mass** will be on Saturday morning, **November 1st**, **at 8:00 am**.

Sunday, **November 2** is the **Feast of All Souls**. It is a very important feast in which we pray for all deceased persons, those known and unknown to us. This feast replaces the normal Sunday of Ordinary Time. On that day we will place the Memorial Book in front of the pulpit where it will remain throughout the month of November.

A Statement on Physician-Assisted Suicide

To live in a manner worthy of our human dignity, and to spend our final days on this earth in peace and comfort, surrounded by loved ones - that is the hope of each of us. In particular, Christian hope sees these final days as a time to prepare for our eternal destiny. Today, however, many people fear the dying process; fear experiencing pain and suffering, losing control over bodily functions, or lingering with severe dementia. They worry about being abandoned or becoming a burden on others. Our society can be judged by how we respond to these fears. A caring community devotes more attention, not less, to members facing the most vulnerable times in their lives.

When people are tempted to see their own lives as diminished in value or meaning, they most need the love and assistance of others to assure them of their inherent worth. The healing art of medicine is an important part of this assistance. Even when a cure is not possible, medicine plays a critical role in providing "palliative care" - alleviating pain and other symptoms and meeting basic needs. Such care should combine medical skill with attention to the emotional as well as spiritual needs of those facing the end of

Today there is a campaign to respond to these fears in a radically different way. Terms like "Death with Dignity" or "Medical Aid in Dying" describe a self-inflicted death, generally using a drug overdose prescribed by a doctor for the purpose of suicide. This campaign to legalize physician assisted suicide has been rejected by most policymakers in our society. A few states permit it. The claim of a constitutional right to assisted suicide was firmly rejected in 1997 by the U.S. Supreme Court and some years ago by the Supreme Judicial Court in Massachusetts. With expanded funding from wealthy donors, assisted suicide proponents keep renewing their aggressive campaign through legislation. States like Massachusetts, where most legislators and governor are supportive, are being targeted.

Jewish and Christian moral traditions have long rejected the idea of assisting in another's suicide. Catholic teaching views suicide as a grave offense against love of self, one that also breaks the bonds of love and solidarity with family, friends, and God. To assist another's suicide is to take part in "an injustice which can never be excused, even if it is requested" (John Paul II, Evangelium Vitae, no. 66). Most people, regardless of religious affiliation, know that suicide is a terrible tragedy, one that a compassionate society should work to prevent. They realize that allowing doctors to prescribe the means for their patients to kill themselves is a corruption of the healing art.
