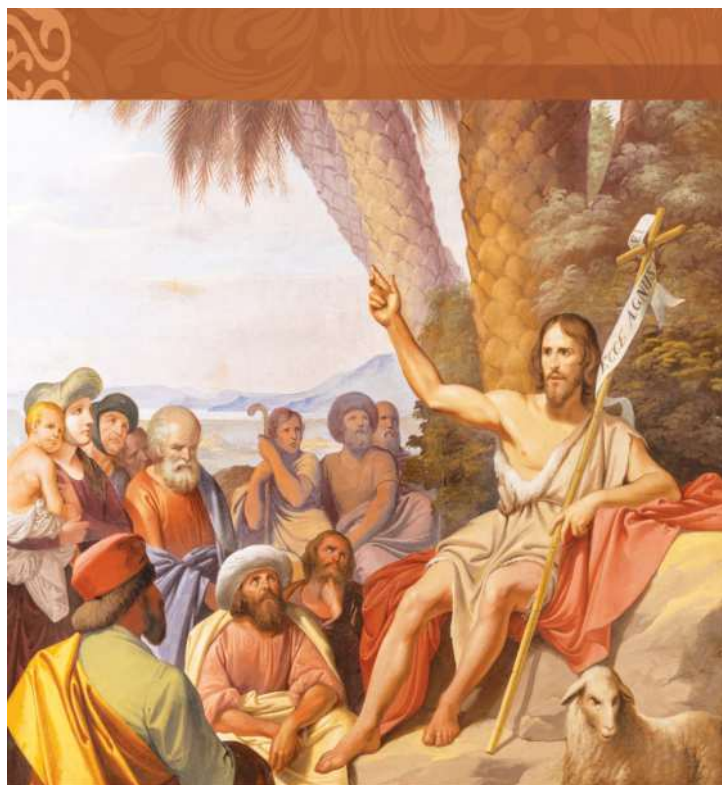

And the Knights added to these through purchasing additional ones.

The **Knights' Annual Diaper Drive** also had a goal of \$5,000. Our Knights work in concert with Catholic Charities which distributes these diapers to mothers in need throughout Worcester County. We raised **\$12,967** for this drive. This translates into **over 60,000** diapers for local mothers.

Thanks for your Thanksgiving Day Generosity to the Poor

We thank all those who brought gifts of food for the poor at our Thanksgiving Day Mass. This annual custom accumulated three carloads of food for the food pantry of Our Lady of Providence Parish on Lincoln Street. In addition, monetary gifts of \$504 were made, and two \$50 gift cards for use at the Big Y. These gifts represent the goodness of our faith community. Father Jonathan Slavinkas told Monsignor Sullivan (later that Thanksgiving Day), "Thank you so much very much. You have no idea how impactful all the food donations were to the parish! Thank you for all you're doing for us!"

Gaudete Sunday - Third Sunday of Advent

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as **Gaudete** Sunday. The word “**gaudete**” comes from the Latin word “**gaudium**,” meaning “joy.” The nearness of Christmas is reason for great joy. Our Entrance Antiphon is: “Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice.” Advent is a time of joyful expectation and eager preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas. There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is greater joy in recalling the birth of Jesus. The joy is heightened because he was born to save us from our sins. The joy also extends to anticipation of the Second Coming, either at the end of physical life or the end of the world, the time when believers will be given the crown of righteousness and a place in the Father’s house to dwell with God and his angels and saints for all eternity.

Rose represents joy and may be used as the liturgical color for **Gaudete** Sunday. Violet remains the official color for the Season of Advent, the Third Sunday included, because all of Advent has a penitential tone, a time to be absolved of sin and be in the state of grace for Christmas. **Gaudete** Sunday offers a brief respite to focus on the uplifting, upcoming joyful celebration of the Nativity. The priest may wear a rose chasuble and stole. The third candle of the Advent wreath is rose.

The prayers today convey a joyful message. The immediacy of Christmas is addressed in the Collect (opening prayer), “O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord’s Nativity,” followed by two explicit references to joy: “enable us ... to attain the joys of so great a salvation” and “to celebrate them with ... glad rejoicing.”
