LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Good dietitians will remind us that we are not only the product of what we eat but the disciplines we undertake. Experts tell us that attending to these increases our chances for a longer life. While this is certainly a worthy pursuit, is our earthly life really the one that requires the most attention and effort? Faith kicks in to remind us that we are meant to live forever with God. Hence, isn't it our eternal destiny that requires most of our effort and attention? The food and nourishment we need to achieve this goal and fine tune our souls for this promised inheritance are the Body and Blood of Christ. Only this heavenly sustenance will unite us with God and our brothers and sisters, strengthen us to do what the Gospel asks us to do and prepare us for life eternal. Through the discipline of prayer, our desire to receive our Lord is deepened. It is this yearning, above anything else, that we want clearly seen and front and center when we close our eyes in death. God loves us so much that he gave us his only begotten Son. Let us rush to receive him!

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading:

We hear in the reading from Genesis a victory meal of bread and wine between Abraham and Melchizedek, king of Salem. This is the Bible's first recorded meal of thanksgiving. Why do you think celebratory meals are so central to the storyline of the Bible?

Second Reading:

In his letter to the Corinthians written around 55AD, Paul preserves for us the earliest attestation of the words Jesus spoke at the Last Supper. Jesus' institution of the Eucharist is core to our faith. Why do you think more Christians today do not appreciate the importance of this tradition?

Gospel:

The miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 with loaves and fishes in many ways helps all believers understand how we need to be nourished by Jesus. In what ways does the Eucharist feed and sustain you in your daily life?

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Over the past months the renewed Parish Pastoral Council has been meeting regularly to work on a plan for the next few years in the life of our parish.

The main Groups in the PPC are: Divine Worship, Discipleship, Evangelisation, Community, Service. There will be specific people within each of these groups who intentionally focus on Youth and Family, who may also meet as additional groups.

The main groups are also supported by a Communications Group and the Parish's Finance & Fabric Group.

Thinking about their own groups remit: the members were asked to picture walking into St Charles in 5 <u>years time</u> and seeing things that inspired them and make them think of St. Charles as an amazing parish, which was being everything a parish should be in our times. Since that is what we want to be then the that is what we are planning to be.

The dreams will only become the reality if we all involve ourselves in this. Everyone is important, everyone is needed, everyone is a valued member of our parish.

Over the next months and years, we want to build on all the great things that have marked the life story of this parish for 125 years and add our own exciting chapters.

If you are reading this, then we want you to play your part in this. We can't make those dreams the reality without you. Whenever there is an invitation to be a part of something, and there will be many invitations, ask if it feels like God is calling you to respond.

Each group has chosen its own first priority- something that will be achievable within 2022, as well as other longer term areas that they will work on.

In the autumn we will also begin to look at how we best work with, encourage and support young people in our parish community. As we begin that particular work we will want the whole parish to be praying for those who will be discerning the right pathway forward in our youth work. When that's starting we will have a novena of prayer that we want everyone to join in seeking the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis.


I am really excited about these next few years in our parish, I know we are going to be doing some really brilliant things and I am so looking <u>forward to</u> being a part of all of this with you.



> When He died on the cross He offered up His Body and Blood for us.




Jesus also gave us His Body and Blood to eat and drink at the Last Supper.


Connect the dots to see where He comes to us now!

When Jesus fed the crowd of five thousand with five loaves and two fish, He was giving an example of how He could feed everyone with His Body and Blood in Holy Communion.



When Jesus went back to Heaven He didn't want to leave us all alone, so He gave Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. First He gave Himself to the Apostles at the Last Supper, and today He gives Himself to us in Holy Communion.

Normally when we eat something it gets absorbed into our body. But receiving Jesus in Holy Communion does something different. It makes us more into Jesus' Body! It brings our soul closer to God and closer to all the other people in the Church. That's what "Communion" means.


When we go to Communion in a state of grace we can get so much more grace from God. Our venial (small) sins can be taken away and we can get more strength to do His will. In fact, the time that your prayers are the most powerful is right after you receive Holy Communion, when Jesus is right inside you. He is your closest friend and only wants what is good for you. When you go to Communion remember Who you just received and don't forget to thank Him for coming to you!




