## NOTES FROM THE PASTOR




Looking back at our life, we may recognize a particular person or a specific experience that caused us to make a significant change or to go in a different direction than we would have otherwise. Hopefully, the change was good, enabling us to think bigger, do better things, and use our talents in a way that we had not considered before. This is what happens in today's readings. Isaiah is called by God to be his prophet (Isaiah 6:1-8). In the beginning, Isaiah does not feel worthy of this call, but by the end of today's First Reading, he is responding with "Here I am, send me!"

It is a similar experience for Simon in today's Gospel (Luke 5:1-11). Simon and his fishing companions are getting out of their boats and washing their nets after having been fishing all night without catching anything. But by the end of this Gospel, the same fishermen have abandoned their boats, left everything, and followed Jesus. What a remarkable turnaround!

This transformation in Simon did not begin with Jesus saying "follow me" from the very beginning. Instead, Jesus eases Simon and the others into discipleship. He tells them to "Put out a short distance." This may have annoyed them at first as they were tired from having fished all night and were discouraged at having caught nothing. But Simon did take his boat out a short distance from the shore, and he could no doubt hear Jesus, as our Lord spoke to the crowds teaching them. Then Jesus took Simon a second step, instructing him to "Put out into the deep water and lower your nets for a catch." At first, Simon objected, pointing out that they had worked all night and caught nothing, but then he agreed to do as Jesus had said, and they caught so many fish that their nets were in danger of tearing. Simon is astonished. By the time they return to shore with their large catch of fish, they leave everything and follow Jesus.

This encounter applies to our lives as well. Jesus doesn't necessarily ask us to leave everything right away. Sometimes he comes to us in ways that we can accept, bit by bit, just as he did with Simon. And just like Simon, we come to know Jesus better and better as we commit to following him more closely in our lives.

Jesus will meet us where we are. Little by little he will invite us to take the next step toward becoming faithful disciples. It is not something we will accomplish on our own but only with the gift of God's grace. Little by little our lives will change, and our "catch" will be overflowing.

 **CATHOLIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE INSTRUCTION (CCD) for Kindergarten through 7th Grades**—Classes are on Wednesdays during the school year from 3:45—5:30 PM. CRE: *Mrs. Bernadette Chavez*

 **CONFIRMATION**—CRE: *Mrs. Josephine Roe*


 **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)**—CRE: *Kathy O'Neill* This is a program for individuals interested in becoming Catholic and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation. Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8 PM.

 **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**—Couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date. They must participate in a Weekend for Engaged Couples and attend an introductory class in Natural Family Planning.

 **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**—The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is offered the third Sunday of the month after the 12:00 PM Mass. Arrangements are to be made in person at the parish office. A birth certificate is required. Parents and godparents must attend a Baptism class that is offered the first Wednesday of the month at 7:00 PM in Room 1 of Fatima-Gallagher Hall. *Pre-registration for the class is required.* Godparents must be at least 16 years old, confirmed and actively practicing their Catholic faith. If Godparents are married, they must be married according to the norms of the Catholic Church.



The Office of Worship at the Archdiocese of Santa Fe has issued the following directives to be implemented at Masses during the flu season effective January 19, 2019.

**Liturgical Directives for the Flu Season  
from the Archdiocese of Santa Fe**

New Mexico is one of the states listed by the U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as having widespread flu outbreaks and high Influenza-like Illness (ILI) Activity.

Due to the severity of the flu season, parishes within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe will be taking the following steps in regards to the celebration of Mass:

- During the Sign of Peace, instead of shaking hands or hugging, as is practiced in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your head and offer a verbal greeting of peace while avoiding bodily contact.
  - When praying the Our Father, please do not hold hands. Simply extend your hands toward Heaven or fold your hands.
  - Holy Communion will not be received under both species, just the Consecrated Host and not the Chalice with the Precious Blood.
  - The celebrant of any Mass in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe is to encourage the reception of the Consecrated Host in the hands. Please note, many liturgists believe the reception of the Consecrated Host in the hands is considered more appropriate liturgically than receiving the Consecrated Host on the tongue. This directive is aimed at limiting contact with saliva, thus limiting the spread of the flu virus.
  - Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands just prior to distribution Holy Communion and should wash them immediately after distribution. If it is easier, an anti-bacterial gel can be used.
  - If you are sick, sneezing or coughing, it would be best for you to stay home. You are welcome to take advantage of the Sunday TV Masses which are available in English and Spanish. It is not a sin to miss Mass on Sundays if you are ill. Please note the reason for these directives is to limit the spread of influenza and to save lives.
- Please pray for all who have lost their lives as a result of the flu, and may we do our part to prevent its spread. These directives will be revoked when the situation improves.
