

This coming Saturday, March 25th, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord – nine months to the day of his birth in Bethlehem. The Gospel for that day is Luke 1:26-38, and it describes the event of the Annunciation, and encourages us to follow the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary by placing our trust in God. The Archangel Gabriel greeted Mary with "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." These words brought confusion to Mary and troubled her. The angel spoke again telling her "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Then we hear the angel's announcement that Mary has been chosen by God to bear His Son, Jesus. For her part, Mary was uncertain of how this could be possible, but when the angel revealed that the "power of the Most High" would make all this possible, Mary was willing to respond: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Mary trusted God's plan for her even though she did not fully understand it. To be part of the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Messiah must have filled Mary's heart with joy and more than a little bewilderment as well.

There is so much we can learn from this Annunciation. Mary knew God, she placed her trust in Him even when she must have had unanswered questions in her mind. What would her family think? How would Joseph react to this turn of events? How would she manage all that was being asked of her?

We know about human trust. We go to people we know when we need advice about decisions that affect our daily living - our careers, our health, our family relationships. How much more readily should we go to God, whom we come to know through Jesus Christ, for the decisions we make concerning our spiritual lives? We turn to God in faith and reason. In his papal encyclical "Fides et Ratio" ("Faith and Reason") Pope Saint John Paul II states: "Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth – in a word, to know himself – so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves." In his words and actions, Jesus showed us his Father and remains with us through his Holy Spirit and through the Sacraments, especially the Most Holy Eucharist. This is the God we can know and trust with our immortal



Saint of the Week

Born Aloysius Philip Schwartz on September 18, 1930, during the great depression, in Washington D.C, "Father Al" decided at an early age that he wanted to be a missionary priest among the poor. After his ordination as a diocesan priest in Washington D.C. in 1957, he petitioned to be sent to South Korea during the Korean War and was formally accepted by the Diocese of Pusan, South Korea. He spent the rest of his life embracing a life of poverty and changing the course of Korean history for those most in need.

Once in South Korea, Father Al was immediately faced with the stark reality of extreme poverty among children there orphaned because of the war. He witnessed people surviving by picking through garbage dumps for what little they could eat, sell, or repurpose and he immediately decided to begin a charity program to provide some relief in his new community. After returning to the USA for a few years due to illness and spending that time raising funds and support for his mission in Korea, he returned to pastor St. Joseph Parish while also establishing the Sisters of Mary Religious Congregation and, years later, the Brothers of Christ to aid in his work.

Of this work, Fr. Al said, "To serve the poor in the name of Christ is not a game. It is not play-acting, nor is it child's play. It means constant pain, discomfort, humiliation, suffering, and sacrifice. In a word, it means the Cross."

Together with the Sisters and Brothers of his orders, he went on to establish Boys-towns and Girls-towns to serve the orphans and street children of South Korea. He also built hospitals and hostiles for many different demographics of Koreans in need. During his vocation, he chose to live in poverty among those he served, often going without electricity, or running water.

In 1985 he expanded his charities and founded the Sisters of Mary, Manila in the Philippines and in 1989 they also expanded to Mexico. He was named a Monsignor in 1990, won the Ramon Magsaysay Award — often referred to as the Nobel Prize of the Pacific — and was also nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for his foundation of orphanages around the world. Soon after, his health deteriorated due to ALS and he died in 1992 in Manila, hearing confessions, preaching, and going to daily Mass right up until the end even though the disease confined him to a wheelchair.

His legacy of humor and joy is carried on by those still in the Sisters of Mary and the Brothers of Christ as they continue to serve populations in Korea, the Philippines, Central and South America. To this date more than 170,000 children have graduated from their schools and have been elevated out of abject poverty through jobs, self-employment, and vocations. Pope Francis named Father Al Venerable on January 22, 2015.



Annual Catholic Appeal

We are six weeks into the 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) Campaign. The ACA provides approximately 30% of the funding for ministries of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, and every parish is assigned a mandatory goal. Our assigned goal is \$38,000 in paid pledges this year. As of February 28, 2023, we have received pledges of \$32,631 of which \$21,995 has already been paid. Our average pledge this year has been \$379.43 and we have received 86 pledges so far compared to 108 pledges for all of 2022. 17% of our parishioner families have made a pledge so far. Remember that all paid pledges that are in excess of our goal will be rebated back to our parish. I encourage all parishioners to participate and make a pledge to the ACA. Every pledge – regardless of size - helps us move closer to achieving the goal. Remember that you can pay your pledge all at once, monthly or quarterly. You can also pay your pledge using a credit card or electronic fud transfer from your bank account. If you have not already made a pledge to ACA for 2023, please prayerfully consider doing so.
