

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). This is a time to celebrate – in a particularly focused way – what we celebrate and believe every time we gather at Christ's altar for Mass. That is, we profess the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of, and under the appearance of, bread and wine in the Most Holy Eucharist.


In today's Scripture Readings we see a parallel between the Israelite people in their flight from Egypt and wandering in the desert to Jesus' feeding of us with his Body and Blood. At the end of their forty-year Exodus journey, Moses reminds the Israelites of the faithfulness that God had shown to them in providing what they needed in the desert, and he instructs them not to forget that God had guided them, fed their hunger and quenched their thirst. The story of the people of Israel in the desert is our story as well. We, too, face unknown physical and spiritual dangers as we journey through our lives. Just as the manna kept the people of Israel alive through their journey, so, too, does the Eucharist keep our hearts and souls alive in the desert of our earthy life.

But the parallel with the manna in the desert is only partial. Our "manna," the Eucharist, is so much more than simply "food for the earthly journey." Jesus tells us in the Gospel today (John 6:51-58) that if we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we will remain in him and he in us, and that he will lead us to eternal life. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." The Eucharist we receive at Mass on Sunday carries us throughout the week, as Jesus remains in us. He is a steady presence, sharing in the good times and the struggles of our lives. Let us pray for an ever-greater awareness of the True Presence that remains within us so that we can be the Body and Blood of Christ to others. On June 19, 2022 – the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ last year – the Catholic bishops of the United States began a three-year initiative known as "The National Eucharistic Revival." The purpose of this mission is to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist."



It aims to inspire, educate, and unite the faithful (and especially the *unfaithful*} with regard to our Catholic belief that Jesus is truly present – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Most Holy Eucharist. According to a study by the Pew Research Center, only 31% of Catholics even believe in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. During this time of "National Eucharistic Revival" our parish will have special events that seek to enhance our belief in the True Presence. It begins today with the distribution of a book by Bishop Robert Barron entitled "This Is My Body." Parishioners are encouraged to read this book and share it with others. We also have other events coming up, including a display of Eucharistic Miracles that will be a part of our Celebration of the Miracle of the Sun in October, commemorating the final appearance of Our Lady of Fatima to the shepherd children.

On this feast of Corpus Christi, established by Pope Urban IV in the year 1264, we celebrate the miracle of the Eucharist. When we share in the Eucharist, we share in Jesus' miraculous love for us and for all sinners. Our Lord Jesus Christ, truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament, is worthy of our worship, our reverence, and our love.

Saint of the Week

St. Norbert | June 6

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he died.
