Most people have some form of financial debt these days. It might be the mortgage on a home, or a car payment, or the repayment of student loans from college, or credit card debt. We're used to debt and we're used to receiving statements reminding us of how much we owe. One of the great fears we may have is that circumstances may arose in which we are unable to repay what we owe. Imagine, then, going to your mailbox and getting a letter telling you that all of your debts had been paid in full. My guess is that our first reaction would be "Wow!" And then, after a few minutes of amazement, we might come back down to reality and ask ourselves, "So, what's the catch?"

Think about it in light of today's Gospel (Matthew 18:21-35) in which the servant's huge, un-payable debt is kindly and fully forgiven by the king. While the servant leaves with a sense of profound relief, what he does not seem to clearly understand is that there is a catch in all of this. He, the servant, must forgive the debts of others, as he, the servant, had been forgiven by the gracious king. And that's the catch for all of us: realizing that in his great mercy, God has forgiven our sins, and thus we are called upon to extend forgiveness to others.

In the Penitential Rite of the Mass as well as the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we ask for, and receive, God's mercy. And we come to the realization that we must forgive others just as we have been forgiven by Christ. Today's Gospel began with Jesus speaking about the breadth of the forgiveness that we are called upon to offer. Peter asks Jesus, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Peter thinks he is being generous. Remember that in the Bible the number seven represents fullness and completion. God had created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. In Peter's eyes he is offering the fullness of forgiveness. But to his amazement, Jesus answers: "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." Now, I can just imagine hearing some people saying, "Look, I've already forgiven you seventy-six times. You only have one more forgiveness left!" But the number seventy-seven is, of course, symbolic and means that we are to forgive without limit, just as God has forgiven us without limit.

Feast Day of St. Padre Pio

Saturday, September 23, 2023, is the feast day of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, better known as St. "Padre Pio". He was born on May 2, 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. He was ordained as a priest with the Franciscan Capuchin friars on August 10, 1910, and lived the rest of his life in San Giovanni Rotondo where he built a hospital to serve the poor. While praying before a crucifix on September 20, 1918, he received the gift of the stigmata – the crucifixion wounds of Christ – which remained open and bleeding for nearly fifty years. St. Pio died on September 23, 1968. Despite his worldwide notoriety as a confessor and spiritual director, Padre Pio once commented: "I only want to be a poor friar who prays."
