

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. The season of Advent is a four-week season in which we prepare for the celebration of the coming of the Lord. It is a dual anticipation in that we prepare for celebrating our commemoration of the Birth of Jesus over 2000 years ago in Bethlehem, and we also prepare for his Second Coming at the end of time. The word "advent" is derived from the Latin word "adventus," which means "coming." Advent is a time full of reflection, excitement, and hope. Advent is also a season in which we should be particularly mindful of our need for repentance and good works as we listen to the long-ago cry of John the Baptist: "Prepare the way of the Lord!"

In addition to prayerful reflection and introspection, we see certain liturgical changes during the season of Advent. Most noticeable is that the priest and deacon wear purple (violet) colored vestments and the "Gloria" is omitted at Sunday Mass, although the "Alleluia Verse" is still sung just prior to the proclamation of the Gospel (unlike during Lent when the "Alleluia Verse" is omitted). In our church and in many homes, it is common to have an Advent Wreath. Traditionally, the Advent Wreath is a circle of evergreen branches. Both the evergreen branches and the circular shape are symbolic of eternity. The circle, without beginning or end, reflects the eternal existence of God who is without beginning or end, and is a physical representation of God's eternal love for us. The Advent Wreath has four colored candles – three purple for the first, second, and fourth Sundays of Advent, and one rose (pink) candle for the third Sunday. Sometimes a fifth candle that is white is placed in the center of the wreath for Christmas. The candles represent coming as the light in the darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. Each of the candles represents an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent. The First Sunday, a purple candle is lit and it is the Candle of Hope. On the Second Sunday, a second purple candle is lit and it is the Candle of Peace. On the Third Sunday, the rose (pink) candle is lit and this is the Candle of Joy. Finally, on the Fourth Sunday, another purple candle is lit and this is the Candle of Love. Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love – these are at the heart of the Advent season.

This time of year, we start seeing many classic holiday movies centering on the idea of "the magic of Christmas spirit." At the end of many of these films, the antagonist is fundamentally changed for the better: the Grinch's heart grows, Scrooge becomes generous, and dozens of films end with skeptics finding joy in the season. While most of these holiday classics are secular, they do touch on the idea that we as Catholics believe: Christmas changes things. The difference is that we don't believe that Santa or magic is what causes these changes; rather, we know that Jesus' coming is what changed everything.

During this preparatory season of Advent, we focus on paving the way for Christ's coming, both at Christmas and at the Second Coming. Isaiah prophesies many wonderful changes when the Lord comes: the deaf will hear, the blind will see, tyrants will be gone. People will rejoice, reverencing and honoring God.

We also consider how welcoming Christ into our lives can change us.



- 4. Cotton footed sleepers, size preemie -12 months
- 5. Long sleeve onesies, size preemie -12 months
- 6. Solid color pants, size preemie-12 months
- -These can be difficult to find locally. Amazon has three or four packs of Simple Joys by Carters and Hanes Flexy.



# REHEARSAL FOR THE CHRISTMAS EVE MASS CHILDREN'S PLAY TODAY AT 1:00 PM IN THE CHURCH

The Christmas play will be performed before the 4:00 PM Mass on December 24th.





We are adding something new to our parish activities this Advent. Given the popularity of Stations of the Cross during Lent, we are adding an Advent devotion attributed to the Franciscans called the Stations of the Crib. It is modeled on the Stations of the Cross and is presented as 14 stations from the Annunciation to the early childhood of Jesus. They will be held in the church each Friday during Advent (note that there is no 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of Advent this year) starting at 6:30pm. The Stations should take about 30 minutes. Folding cards with the Stations have been ordered for distribution to those in attendance.

Following the Stations, there will be a 20 to 30 minute Advent reflection by a member of the parish clergy. Confession will also be available during the Stations and reflection. Then, after the Stations/reflection/confessions, there will be coffee, hot cocoa, and Christmas cookies served in the parish hall for those who wish to attend. The cookies will be provided by a different ministry each of the three evenings. This social time will begin about 7:30pm and last no later than 8:30pm including clean-up.

These three evenings are taking the place of an Advent parish mission as well as an Advent penance service. You are invited to participate in these Advent liturgies on December 8<sup>th</sup> (following the 5:30pm Mass for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – a Holy Day of Obligation), December 15<sup>th</sup>, and December 22<sup>nd</sup>.



#### Las Posadas

Posadas will be celebrated on Sunday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 5:00 pm in the church.

We will then continue in procession to various doors on the parish campus as Joseph and Mary seek a place to stay.

The procession will conclude at Fatima-Gallagher Hall where there will be a piñata for the kids, posole and other refreshments.
