

A note From the pastor

Opportunities may arise each day that may not come our way again. In order to take advantage of them, one must seize the day ("Carpe diem!" as it is said in Latin). Sad to say, many times people just fail to respond, and lose out on an opportunity. God places an array of opportunities before his people; opportunities to choose life. God not only gave us life, he redeemed our lives and showed us the path to everlasting life through the ministry and sacrifice of his Son, Jesus.

Our Scripture Readings today give us examples of people who seized the moment in choosing the path of life. Our First Reading (Jonah 3:1-5, 10) clearly shows the opportunity that God presented to the Ninevites through the prophet Jonah. Jonah declared that the city of Nineveh and all of its inhabitants would be destroyed at the end of forty days unless they repented of their sinfulness. The people of Nineveh seized the moment. The king and all of his subjects immediately repented of their sins and were spared. The story makes it clear that there would be no second chance. Only an immediate response would put them on the path of life – and they responded.

The call of the Apostles to follow Jesus was another blessed opportunity from God. We hear in the Gospel (Mark 1:14-20) how Jesus laid this opportunity before Peter, Andrew, James, and John. Despite any apprehension they might have felt due to family or work, they seized the moment. They abandoned their former way of life and followed Jesus. There was little time to think about it. Their immediate response placed them in the path of life, alongside the Lord.

Each of us was given new life in Christ in the Sacrament of Baptism. We were "born again" as well as "born from above" (the original Greek word used in John's Gospel has both meanings) in Baptism. This is critically important, for Jesus said to Nicodemus in John 3:5 – "Amen, Amen I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit."

Saint of the Week

Biography St. Juliana of Cornillon (1193-1258), also known as St. Juliana of Liège, was born near modern-day Liège, Belgium. When she was 5 years old, she and her twin sister became orphans. Following the deaths of their parents, the sisters were entrusted to the care of the Augustinian nuns at Mont-Cornillon. Growing up among the religious, Juliana's spiritual journey flourished. At age 13, she entered the order.

Juliana's profound love for Christ in the Eucharist was ignited during her time at the convent. She regularly participated in Mass and spent hours in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. In her prayers, she often experienced mystical visions, reinforcing her belief in the real presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine.

Driven by her desire to see a dedicated feast to honor Christ in the Eucharist, St. Juliana took it upon herself to promote the idea fervently. She eventually became the Prioress of the canonry and frequently confided in her mentor, Canon John of Lausanne, telling him about her visions and her hope for the feast. He shared her experiences with his contemporaries, including Pope Urban IV.

Though Juliana died in 1258, her cause won over Pope Urban IV. In 1264 he issued the papal bill "Transiturus de hoc mundo" which instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. The feast aimed to celebrate and affirm the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, emphasizing the significance of the Blessed Sacrament in the life of the Church.

Juliana was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1869 and is remembered not only for the pivotal role she played in establishing the Feast of Corpus Christi, but for her musical talents, teachings, and writings. St. Juliana of Cornillon, pray for us! © LPi
