

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is truly Risen! This proclamation, spoken since the first Easter, reminds us of what this day – the Feast of the Resurrection – is truly all about. In our modern world, Easter is often seen as a one -day event of bunnies, candy, pastel-colored eggs, and a sumptuous family meal. But these things alone really miss the significance that this day truly holds.

Today is the feast of feasts! This is the day all creation longed for from the fall of Adam and Eve. God and humanity are once again made whole. Christ, by his Passion, death, and Resurrection, bridged the chasm between God and humankind caused by sin. The Resurrection is the victory of love and self-giving over the blindness of hatred and sin. Even the once insurmountable obstacle of death is no more; having been overcome by the Father's action of raising Jesus from the dead. The sacrifices we made during Lent should now make way to celebrating the overwhelming abundance of God's grace and mercy. And as Catholics, we celebrate the Easter season for not just one day, but for fifty days!

As we celebrate, it is interesting to realize that according to the Scripture accounts, none of the disciples actually saw Jesus rise from the dead. Much like us, it was their encounters with the Risen Christ that gave the Apostles the courage to proclaim to the world that *Christ* is Risen! It is through our encounters with the Risen Christ, through Scripture and Sacrament, that we receive the grace necessary to share the Good News with

For some people, this day may mean nothing significant. But we, who celebrate today as a special recognition of the Resurrection of our Savior, know that it signifies our hope of eternal life with God. For us, it provides a perfect opportunity to be renewed in the Lord as we open our hearts more fully to him. This will enable us, in turn, to share the power and the promise of the Resurrection with others, and thus to share more fully in the Easter joy. *Alleluia!*


