Catholic Social Doctrine, Theme 2, Part 2 Family as Foundation of Society

The first installment on Theme 2 actually appeared in the bulletin two weeks ago. So here is its summary of the introduction, just to put us back into the context of this important section of Catholic Social Doctrine.

The introductory text says this: We believe that people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

"The poor and the vulnerable." There they are again. They seem to come up quite a bit in this entire doctrine. And here again, the unborn, poor and vulnerable themselves, show us how to care for all who, like them, depend for their survival on the goodness of others and society's embrace of justice as it is described in the Gospel.

But mere survival is not the goal of Catholic Social Doctrine, nor is it what God seems to want for us. The goal of this powerful teaching, rooted so firmly in the Gospel and in the subsequent human experience in the millennia since biblical times, is that the human person — each one of us — should flourish as God intended when He intentionally created each and every one.

Theme Two characterizes the family as both the object and the source of the compelling enterprise of building a more just world.

Last time, there was a list of ways that each family can pursue a more just way of life, for the family's own good and for the good of society, of which the family is said to be the foundation.

Continuing with the authoritative voices of the leadership of the Church, today we hear how society might (or must) be ordered toward the support of what we claim to be foundational.

From the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB):

Economic and social policies as well as organization of the work world should be continually evaluated in light of their impact on the strength and stability of family life. The long-range future of this nation is intimately linked with the well-being of families, for the family is the most basic form of human community. Efficiency and competition in the marketplace must be moderated by greater concern for the way work schedules and compensation support or threaten the bonds between spouses and between parents and children. (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Economic Justice for All, no. 93)

In this passage, our bishops seem to claim that the way our economy is organized must be adapted to support the wellbeing of families — especially important, if we are claiming that the family is the foundation of society. Work schedules and compensation either support or threaten the bonds between spouses and between parents and children.

This statement by the bishops of the United States poses a significant challenge — a pretty bold one — to the established way things are done in our society today. Perhaps we might prayerfully think about the implications of actually putting this teaching into practice, as we look forward to more on this theme next time.


