CST Theme 6 Part 2: Learning to Fish

You've heard the saying, "Power tends to corrupt, but absolute power corrupts absolutely." It is attributed to Lord Acton (1834-1902). This well-known phrase was used in a leadership seminar that I found very constructive as a student in 2000, and then whose faculty I was invited to join in the following year. We used this quote in a session on the appropriate use of power in ministry leadership. And we quoted Lord Acton as if everyone, including us, knew who he was. I had never heard of the guy.

One day, it occurred to me to look him up. He was an "aphorist," I found. And then I had to look up "aphorist." An aphorist is a person who says aphorisms, which, I found as I looked that up, are pithy, memorable little sayings. Ever since, I have wondered why I was not informed of this as a career possibility when I was much younger. Aphorist sounds like it would be a cool job.

All of this is to preface another aphorism which is pertinent to this theme of Catholic Social Doctrine. "Give a man a fish and he eats for a day. Teach a man to fish and he will eat for life." This is a constructive-sounding concept which is sometimes used as a reason for not actually helping someone in need, and a left-handed way of blaming the one in need for being in need, i.e. not knowing how to do something as simple as fishing.

Solidarity doesn't allow such deflection.
Solidarity means we take our place with the marginalized, not above or away from them.
Solidarity means that we do everything: we give a few fish to take the edge off, we teach good and sustainable fishing, and we head upstream to make sure that somebody else isn't grabbing all the fish.
Solidarity means we see ourselves and the "others" — those in need, those who will struggle every day to feed themselves and their families — as part of one family.

Catholic Social Teaching repeatedly makes a direct connection between justice and peace, or conversely, between injustice and violence. A quote from Pope Francis that appeared in this series in Theme 3, Part 1, has stuck with me ever since, and it applies to this theme as well. He's talking about the overall welfare of society, built on

the "basic cell" of the family, social peace, stability and security. These, he says, are provided by a certain <u>order which cannot be achieved without particular concern for distributive justice</u>; **whenever this is violated, violence always ensues.** (Pope Francis, On Care for Our Common Home [Laudato Si'], no. 157)

Violence, as we see daily in the news, happens everywhere, every day. Violence is a crime in almost every instance. But while it may be inexcusable, it is readily understandable. And understanding its cause is an essential step toward its reduction and elimination. Take Pope Francis's quote above as an equation, and reverse it:

Whenever violence occurs, look for a violation of distributive justice as its cause.

What does this mean? The marginalized often have no stake in maintaining order and building a society in which they do not participate fully. They are expected to comply with laws and policies made and enforced by people who are living comfortably while their basic human needs go unmet. The US has the sixth highest rate of incarceration in the world. But we have by far a higher chance of being shot just for going about our daily business than anywhere else. And that's just one form of violence that plagues our society. Incarceration is obviously not the solution. Solidarity, justice, and the defense of the dignity of every human person are the way out of this, and there are enough of us Catholic Christians to make it happen.
