

## On the Road Again

You'll recall that, several weeks ago, we heard a rather lengthy Gospel reading about a guy who was raised from the dead. No, not that guy. The other one. His name was Lazarus. It was all a big deal. He was buried four days, he was a friend of Jesus, and his sisters were all over Jesus about not being there when they needed Him. Jesus weeps, He prays, and then He commands Lazarus to come out of the tomb, and to everyone's amazement, he does.

And where is Lazarus today? He's dead, that's where. Lazarus was raised from the dead by resuscitation. His body resumed its normal functions, and he lived again, for whatever amount of time it was; we never heard anything more about him. But he's dead now, that's for sure.

But the Easter story is, as people often say but shouldn't, a whole nother story. Last Sunday's Gospel, the story of the journey to Emmaus, illustrates very clearly what's different about the Resurrection of Jesus.

You know how it goes: two disciples are walking dejectedly along the road to Emmaus, about seven miles outside of Jerusalem. A stranger comes alongside and joins them, asking what they've been talking about along the way.

They reply to the effect that this stranger must have been living under a rock for the past week or so, if he doesn't already know what's been going on in Jerusalem. They pour our their disappointment that Jesus did not turn out to be who they thought he was, namely, a powerful messiah ready to restore Israel's glory and drive out the occupying Romans. When they reach their destination for the night, he acts as if he's going to go on farther, but they insist that he stay, so he does. They still don't recognize him.

When they sit down for a meal, however, he takes bread, says the blessing, breaks it, and gives it to them. At this moment, they suddenly realize who their "stranger" companion really is. And at the same moment, He vanishes from their sight.

There are a couple of important details in this story that aren't mentioned too often. It's read on the Third Sunday of Easter in the Liturgical year, but this story does not take place three weeks after Easter. When is it, then? There are two very clear clues: the first is the very first sentence of the reading: "That very day, that first day of the week...". Wait, what? What very day? The very day of the Resurrection, that's what very day!

Later in the story, the two of them add this fact: "it is now the third day since this took place...". And even though they have heard that the women found the tomb empty, but they are nevertheless dejected and have decided to get out of town for a while and regroup. Or maybe just go fishing...

The second "detail" is kind of obvious: these are Jesus' disciples. They've been hanging around with him for three years! Not even three days ago they shared a meal together. And now, they don't recognize Him? This happens repeatedly in post-resurrection encounters. Jesus doesn't look the same. And that makes sense, if you think about it: He is risen in glory, with the glorified body that is physical and yet transcends physical boundaries. He eats food, and you can touch Him, but he also moves freely through locked doors and can be in two places, if not at once, at least far more readily than a physical body can walk from place to place.

Jesus was not resuscitated. This is not exactly the same body as before. This is Christ, risen from the dead into new and eternal life. This is the body that Peter, James, and John glimpsed in the Transfiguration. This is the body, glorified. This is the glory of the Risen Christ and it's the glory promised to all the faithful who live the Gospel as Jesus's disciples. Alleluia!




