Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity

The Easter Season concludes with today's celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, followed by Pentecost next Sunday, Trinity Sunday after that, and then, on June 11, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. And on that Solemnity, with the permission of our bishop, St. Peter's will resume the distribution of the Eucharist in the form of both bread and wine.

The sharing of the cup of the Blood of Christ was suspended, you'll recall, when Covid arrived on the scene. Now, indications are that this practice may resume safely, and that its benefits make a compelling case for going forward.

But why did we start receiving from the Cup in the first place? It's about *Incarnation*. We know that, in the consecrated host, the entire Christ is present: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This is true in even a small fragment of the host, or a single drop of consecrated wine.

We also know that God's power is infinitely beyond all our understanding. For example, God could —and does — impart grace, love, and mercy without any physical action or contact at all. God could have saved us from our sins by just blinking, or thinking of it; it would have been accomplished instantly.

But God's wisdom took a different path: Incarnation. God created us as physical beings with senses, thoughts, emotions, hopes, dreams, and fears. And so God chose, and chooses, to engage with us on these human terms, which are, after all, His divine work.

So God sent us His Word, the Word by which all things including ourselves are created, to become flesh and dwell among us. This Word, as we know, is made flesh ("incarnate") in the person of Jesus, who is truly and fully human and truly and fully divine.

And when the time came for Jesus to fulfill His mission in this world, He followed suit. Instead of simply assuring us of His thoughts and prayers, He gave us something tangible and human, yet profoundly divine: His own Body and Blood as food and drink to sustain us throughout our life of seeking to know and do the will of our Creator.

By the time of the Second Vatican Council, the Eucharist had become well-established as the true and complete Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ, and the doctrine affirmed at the Council of Trent was well known: in either form and in even the smallest fragment, the complete Christ is truly present. What had also become well-established by the time of the Second Vatican Council was also from Trent: the

need to be free of mortal sin before receiving Holy Communion. (This is still true.) But by the 1950s, a great many Catholics didn't receive Holy Communion most of the time. This had something to do with the extended fast required before receiving Communion, and something to do with a possibly excessive sense of guilt on the part of many Catholics.

All of this is to say that one of the Second Vatican Council's goals was to increase participation in the Eucharist and in the other sacraments and to make them clearer and more compelling in sign and meaning.

One of these steps was to reduce the required Eucharistic fast to one hour before the reception of Holy Communion. Another is to recognize the wisdom of Jesus in offering his Body AND Blood as food AND drink for our benefit and salvation.

Thus, the Council provides for the distribution of both Bread and Wine, consecrated and transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, even though either one would be sufficient. This is the lavish extravagance of God's love and mercy: always giving more, always out-doing us in generosity, kindness, and mercy.

With the images of the 12 Apostles on a red background, these two vessels offer a beautiful way to present the Body and Blood of Christ in the celebration of the Eucharist. (The Ciborium is the vessel that holds the consecrated hosts, both when serving Holy Communion and inside the Tabernacle. A Ciborium can be a stemmed piece, similar to a chalice but generally wider, or a flatter bowl shape.)


