

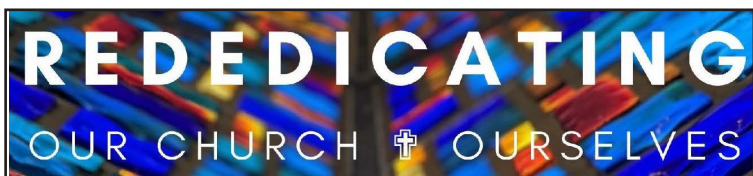

Receiving from the Cup

We know from the earliest days of the Church that we receive the complete Christ in Holy Communion, regardless of exactly how we receive. Once consecrated by the invocation of the Holy Spirit and the remembrance of the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, the bread and wine that were brought to the altar become new substances while retaining its original appearance: the Bread becomes truly and completely the Body of Christ; the wine becomes His Blood.

We are talking about the glorified Body of Christ here, the body as it was after the Resurrection. The Risen Christ's body was transformed. He entered a locked room several times, and "vanished" from the sight of His apostles. He vanished again at Emmaus after walking with the two disciples and even breaking bread with them. Yet He ate charcoal-grilled fish on the beach one morning, and Thomas touched His hands and side. This was / is a physical body, not a vision of some kind, yet it is not bound by earthly physics.

This Body is inexhaustible, and is thus able to feed, nourish, and sustain believers for all time. It is truly Christ's Body, but it is not limited in the way that our bodies are, or in the way that His body was — for He was truly and fully human, as well as divine — prior to His Resurrection.

When we receive the host, this little wafer of unleavened bread made from wheat flour and water, we receive the complete Christ. So why do we need to receive from the Cup of His Blood as well?

Strictly speaking, we don't need to receive from the Cup in order to receive the complete Christ in the Eucharist. But Jesus was well aware of this when He deliberately chose to declare the bread as His Body and the Cup as the Cup of His Blood, and commanded His disciples to "take and eat..." and to "take and drink."

This is about Incarnation: the Word of God became flesh in the person of Jesus for our salvation. God knows that we need a human, tangible experience in order to fully appreciate God's presence, love, and mercy in our life. And so God sent His Son to be one of us and to be among us. And then this Son gave us His own flesh and blood as food and drink, so that He would always be with us.

With all this in mind, receiving Holy Communion in both forms is compelling, but still optional. If, upon

reflecting on all of this, you feel the desire to receive the Eucharist in both forms, you'll have that option beginning June 10 & 11, and continuing from then on.

Receive the host as you normally do (if you receive the host in your hand, step aside and consume it immediately), then step to the minister of the cup. Make a slight bow, same as with the host, see and hear the minister present the cup with the declaration "the Blood of Christ," respond "Amen," and then take the cup in your own hands, take a sip from it, and hand it back to the minister.

The minister will wipe the edge of the cup and turn it slightly. This process is proven effective in terms of safety.

If you prefer not to receive from the Cup, simply return to your place as always.

It is a great blessing to have the fullest experience of sharing in the Eucharist available once again. But the choice of whether to receive under one form or both is yours. There is no judgement.

May the celebration of the Eucharist bring us closer to Christ, make us more faithful to the Gospel, and shine the light of Christ's love on all we meet.

Welcome, Fr. Evelio Ramirez!

Bishop Bradley announced over the weekend that Fr. Evelio Ramirez, currently pastor of St. Theresa, Wayland, and SS Cyril & Methodius, Gun Lake, will become pastor of our parish as well as San Felipe de Jesus and St. Basil.



Fr. Evelio was ordained 10 years ago and, like Fr. Fabio, was born in Colombia. He is fluent in Spanish and English, and is also an accomplished artist (paintings, murals, sculpture).

Fr. Evelio's appointment is effective July 6. More about him in the coming weeks.

Meanwhile, we keep Fr. Evelio and his Wayland / Gun Lake parishes in our prayers as they come to terms with this separation and as Fr. Evelio comes to know and love his new community of faith here on the Lakeshore.

Perhaps you've noticed that the statue forming the central focus of our new parish prayer garden is now in place. It's made by the traditional "Lost Wax Bronze Casting" method, with a fire-applied patina, which provides the variations in color. The statue weights about 350 pounds and comes from Metropolitan Galleries in Miami, FL. Fr. Fabio will bless this bronze sculpture during the weekend of FabioFest. Depicting Jesus, seated, in an encounter with two children, the statue is easily seen from the driveway and parking lot, while also forming a beautiful focal point from inside the chapel. Thanks and congratulations to the Planning Committee for their work on configuring this beautiful outdoor prayer space!



On behalf of St. Peter Parish and the whole Church, Fr. Fabio received Mark Elgersma into full Communion with the Catholic Church last Sunday. Mark was then confirmed and later in the Mass received the Eucharist for the first time. Bill Alwin was Mark's sponsor.
