Doing, Receiving, Becoming, Being, Doing

We are in a transition at the moment, both as a parish and as the universal Church. The Church transitions as of this weekend from the extended season of Lent - Easter - Pentecost to Ordinary Time. The two Solemnities, Trinity and Body and Blood of Christ, form something of a bridge between the season of liturgical white and the long season of green, which is Ordinary Time.

In our parish, the transition is front and center: we are preparing to welcome a new pastor who will provide sacramental ministry, spiritual guidance, teaching, and vision. Fr. Evelio will build on a very fine foundation, built in our parish under the pastoral leadership of Fr. Fabio, to whom we will bid a most fond farewell in just a few weeks.

The good news in all this is that our outgoing and incoming pastors are longtime friends who highly respect each other as individuals and as priests who are called to represent Christ in the unique ministry affirmed in Holy Orders.

This means that we do not have to put our parish life, growth, prayer, worship, formation, or community life on "pause" and wait to see what our new "master" wants us to do. Instead, and much better, we are not only free but compelled to continue to live our own call (the one we received in Baptism and confirmed in ... well, Confirmation ... and which we enrich each week or even each day in the celebration of the Eucharist.

In Baptism, we are called to worship God by living our relationship with Christ. We've had an extended period these several weeks, reflecting on the Eucharist and its expression of the Real Presence of Christ not only in our midst but in our very own body, blood, soul, and humanity.

Every week (more often for some), we gather AS the Body of Christ to hear the Word of God proclaimed, and then, having prayed along with the priest the Eucharistic Prayer and having affirmed our commitment to this prayer with our own hearty "Amen!" We take the Bread of Life and Eat it, and — at last — drink from the Cup of the New Covenant. But we are not finished yet.

After this heavenly banquet, with Christ now Really Present within us ("walking tabernacles," as we heard in last week's homily), we are sent into the world to

proclaim the Good News. And what is the Good News? "The kingdom of God is at hand." And how do we proclaim it? By our interactions with others both up close and in the global perspective.

The world has never needed the Good News more than today (it has also never needed it less...) But how will the Good News reach those who need to hear it? Words have become so cheap, and so predictable as to be almost meaningless. It's very difficult to convince anyone of anything they don't already think or believe. We used to turn on the news to learn what has been or is happening. Today, we select the source of the news so that we will be sure to hear what we want to hear. Every single person reading these words lives in a unique "information bubble" tailored to individual preferences and history.

So how do we break through? By action. We recognize who we are; we believe in what we are doing when we celebrate the Eucharist; we find that we are filled with the Real Presence of Christ. And then it dawns on us that this gift is not meant to be kept privately but to be shared through action. We act like people who are filled with the Real Presence of Christ. We take to heart what Bishop Bradley calls the "Mission of the Eucharist," and we "Go forth to love and serve the Lord," who is a Lord of love, mercy, and justice.

As we savor our reflections on the gifts Fr. Fabio has brought to our parish community, we prepare to welcome Fr. Evelio with open arms and hearts, while continuing to DO the Eucharist, to RECEIVE the Eucharist, and to LIVE what Christ in the Eucharist calls us to do.


