Sensus Fidelium

From last week's Greek word, "synod," we come this week to a time-honored Latin expression, *Sensus Fidelium*, meaning "the sense of the faithful." In broad terms, this means that, when the people of the Church hold a belief in common, it is likely that this belief is true. In fact, one of my favorite quotes from the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (1964) is this: *The entire body of the faithful, anointed as they are by the Holy One, cannot err in matters of belief. (Lumen Gentium. #12)*

There is more; the document goes on to define how this works and how critical it is that the entire body of the faithful be included whenever this principle is invoked to make a point about what the Church believes and teaches. For the sake of brevity, it's like this: *Sensus Fidelium* expresses our confidence in the presence and work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church. But it cannot be taken lightly and is sometimes misused.

First a couple of examples of the *Sensus Fidelium* at work:

Jesus is one person with two natures, namely, divine and human. Jesus is both God and Man. As you may know, this was not settled until the fourth century. The prevailing contrary belief at the time was *Arianism*, which held that Jesus was an especially wonderful, gifted, blessed, and special human being, but that He was not God. Many of the bishops of the Church at that time agreed with the Arian view. But the people of the Church overwhelmingly believed in the dual nature of Jesus, and the bishops finally came around. The Nicene Creed is the product of this very spirited debate. But, to be clear, *Sensus Fidelium* does not pit the laity against the bishops; it takes unity among all of the faithful, laity and bishops alike, to qualify as an example of *Sensus Fidelium*.

Two other famous examples involve Mary, the mother of Jesus. The idea that she was chosen by God to be the Mother of Jesus before she was even conceived (Immaculate Conception) is something that everybody pretty much always believed. The same is true for the belief that she was assumed into heaven, body and soul, saving her body from the corruption of the grave. Because everybody believed in both of these, they were defined as dogmas of the Church in the 19th century by the reigning pope in the time of each.

The essential points of this exercise is to be clear about two things: First, if the entire Church believes

something related to faith and morals, and if by "entire" we understand that both laity and hierarchy are fully involved, and that the Magisterium (teaching authority) of the Church is respected, then it can be said that the Sensus Fidelium is at work. Second, Sensus Fidelium is not a way of developing doctrine via public opinion, nor of justifying defiance of Church teaching simply because a lot of people agree to do so.

So, how might the Church come to know the *Sensus Fidelium*? In other words, how do we know what "everybody" believes? For the hierarchy, a Council can be such a mechanism. The bishops, gathered in dialogue and prayer, can and do produce authoritative teachings. Another mechanism for assessing the *Sensus Fidelium* is a Synod, such as the one taking place right now.

The Synod does not make decisions or define doctrines or even disciplines. It is a dialogue, conducted within a structured process so that the hierarchy, whose head is the Holy Father, can know the insights, opinions, and perspectives of the universal Church. (The Synod taking place in Rome today comes after nearly two years of local consultations around the world.)

The Sensus Fidelium has guided the Church since the beginning, and, properly understood and applied, will continue to be a profound expression of the work of the Holy Spirit in the Body of Christ.
