Two For One Isn't Good Enough

If you're shopping, either online or in person, and you find a "two for one" deal, do you grab it? Sure you do! And does it matter if you don't need two? Certainly not! Whatever it is, you'll use it eventually or you can give it to someone else. But most people would't turn down an 15th without mentioning your firstborn's birthday at all, offer like that.

Our faith life as Catholics, however, doesn't work that way. For one thing, God is far more generous than "buy one, get one free." God's gifts are all free. We don't pay for any of them, and it would be laughably arrogant of us to think otherwise. When it comes to God's grace, we are recipients. We are humbled. Our human capabilities do not include any possibility of reciprocity with God or for what God gives us in His infinite goodness.

Through the 1950s, life as a Catholic was taught to us in terms of rules, laws, and obligations, along with penalties for violating them. One of these was — and still is — the obligation to participate at Mass every Sunday and on certain days in the year designated as Holy Days of Obligation.

When the option for a vigil Mass (Mass of the day on the evening before the day) came into practice in the 1970s, the obligation approach began to show a few cracks: If a Holy Day fell on a Saturday or Monday, and if morning Mass on the fourth Sunday of Advent, because you chose the evening Mass on either Saturday (the vigil Christmas is the bigger feast. Don't do it! Celebrating of Sunday) or on Sunday evening, which would be the vigil of the Holy Day, you could "kill two birds with one stone," or, in other words, get a two-for-one deal on the legal obligation. Except this wasn't really the case.

This illustrates the worst aspect of seeing the practice of our faith in terms of obligations to meet and penalties Christ as food and drink to nourish, sustain, and to avoid: we find ourselves bargaining for a discount on "repaying" an infinite God for infinite goodness. "We thank you, God, for your many gifts, but we'd like to thank you a little less this time. Will that be ok?"

When we gather for worship on a Sunday or Holy Day, we are celebrating the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus in the context of a particular feast — a day marking an event in the life of Jesus, a particular teaching or parable He has given us, an event in the history of the Church, the life of a saint, or similar. Each time we gather is a different celebration, even though the flow of the Mass is very nearly the same every time. The distinct prayers, readings, homily, and overall atmosphere make each day's Mass unique.

For a practical example, try this: Let's say you have two children, one born on October 15 and another born a couple of years later on October 16. Fast forward a few years, and it's October 15 and after dinner there's

a big cake with candles on it and everybody sings happy birthday and enjoys the cake. What does child #2 think when on the 16th there is no cake, no mention of a birthday, and no presents? Or do you go all day on the so that child #2 can have the cake that day?

I'm actually not a parent, but I don't think I would expect that to fly at all. These are two different occasions! And anyway, parents don't celebrate their children's birthdays because they owe the child a birthday party (even though a child who feels slighted might in fact assert that exact idea...) They do it out of love! They wouldn't dream of simply ignoring one or the other birthday just because they fall on consecutive

This year, Christmas falls on a Monday. So the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas are on consecutive days. And there is always Mass on Christmas Eve, which is the Mass of Christmas. If we think of Mass attendance as punching a card that keeps us out of hell or purgatory or just keeps us in the flow of "church" — we might completely miss the fact that Advent and Christmas are two very different experiences.

This year, many will be tempted to skip Sunday each and every Sunday and Holy Day of the year is THE central practice of Catholic faith. It is what inspires, supports, and urges us to "go forth and live the Gospel by our life." And the Eucharist, called the "source and summit" of our life, invites us to share in the very life of animate us.

As you make your Christmas plans, be sure to include both liturgical days: The Fourth Sunday of Advent, Saturday evening or Sunday morning, and Christmas, Sunday evening or Monday morning. Don't let your keen eye for a bargain (which is not even real in this case) deprive you of the full experience of this holy season.


