## Ministry: It means what you think it means, only more

To borrow a few phrases from Dr. Michael Horan, the now-retired head of the Theology Department at Loyola Marymount, Los Angeles, "When I was a boy, a minister was a grey-haired, dignified man in his 50s who drove a blue Buick and was in charge of the Presbyterian or Methodist church in the neighborhood. Today, at my parish, we have 'Parking Ministers..."

Since the Second Vatican Council, the Church has recognized more and more the call of the Baptized — you and me — to serve the Church through various ministries. And it started the practice of referring to those taking particular roles in the Church as "ministers." Since perhaps the 1990s, people who are employed by dioceses and parishes have been referred to as "lay ecclesial ministers." These are people who have some level of education, formation, and credentialing that qualifies them to serve in various roles of leadership and service in the Church.

The broad category "Lay Ecclesial Minister" includes coordinators or directors of Faith Formation, Music, Liturgy, Service to the sick and dying, Business Administration, and a more general category that might be named Pastoral Associate or similar. There are some 30,000 Lay Ecclesial Ministers in the United States today, and our parish employs four who would fit into this category, myself included.

(Insider info: "ecclesial" means "having to do with the Church," from the Greek word ekklesia, which means "an assembly or gathering," and is often used to mean "church." In Spanish, *Iglesia* specifically means "church," and it obviously has the same Greek origin.)

But even with some 30,000 Lay Ecclesial Ministers employed by Catholic parishes and dioceses, there are many multiples of that number who participate in ministry in the Church and on the Church's behalf, as volunteers. That's where you come in, if you're a baptized Catholic Christian and a member of a parish...

So, what, exactly, is "ministry?" The best definition I've read is this:

The public activity of a baptized follower of Jesus Christ flowing from the Spirit's charism and an individual's personality on behalf of a Christian community to witness to, serve, and realize the kingdom of God.\*

Ministry has six characteristics: (1) Doing something (2) for the Advent (coming) of the Reign of God (3) in public (4) on behalf of a Christian community; (5) which is a gift received in faith, baptism, and/or ordination; and (6) which has its own limits and identity within a diversity of ministerial actions.\*

Every baptized Catholic Christian is called to some ministry, and the call comes from the gifts that the Holy Spirit has placed within us. These gifts sometimes manifest in personality traits or in favorite activities or pursuits. Ministry is not always — maybe not often — synonymous with one's career choice, even when one is highly successful. Gifts of the Holy Spirit given to individuals for the good of the Church and the world are called "charisms," and this concept is something to explore as a parish community in significant depth in the new year.

For now, and for this season of Advent, this bulletin space will offer some practical thoughts about ministries from two perspectives: ministries that sustain the Church (meaning the parish, in our case) and ministries that reach out from the Church (also meaning the parish) to serve those in the world around us and beyond.
