Put on your own mask first...

By now we are all familiar with the image.

By now we are all familiar with the image of the Church as the Body of Christ. And this body, as described by St. Paul, has many parts, all of which work together to live the Gospel. As the Body of Christ, we find ourselves called to do the things that Jesus would do, if He were here, physically walking about the earth. But wait! He is here, isn't he? He is here in His Church, His people, whom He has called and sent to teach, heal, and serve.

Do you still find it a bit jarring when the flight attendant gives the instructions about the oxygen mask? "Put your own mask on first, then assist others." We are conditioned to serve ourselves last, to put others first — at least when we are on our best behavior. But if the airplane becomes de-pressurized, we might be just moments away from passing out due to a lack for oxygen. And even if we are the Mother Theresa of the airways, we can't help anyone else if we are unconscious. So we must ignore the impulse to put others first, and instead ensure our own survival so that we can be of service.

The Body of Christ is no different. There is a need for members of this Body to serve the Body itself so that the Church — that means you and me — can serve others by word, example, and deed.

I don't want to get into a generational issue here, but I can only imagine what our parish might look like to someone who is 17, or 25, or 35, or even 40-something. What do I imagine it looks like? The setting, the entry, the Gathering Space, and the worship space certainly look inviting, welcoming, and beautiful. The greeters and the priest, I'm sure, appear — and are — sincerely welcoming, friendly, and caring.

But there are two things that are going on just below this welcoming surface: there are numerous openings for ministry that go unfilled week after week. And the average age of all those who serve in scheduled ministries is certainly something just barely south for 70.

There's nothing wrong with older people. I'm one of them, and I'm hoping to be one for a nice long time yet to come. But if I am to imagine what a person 1/2 my age might see at Mass, I'm thinking it might be "none of the people up front look like me..."

(In fact, someone about half my age actually did say that to me!)

Dear younger friends: There is room in this parish for you and your gifts. There is a need for what you have to offer. If you see the same (older) people doing the same visible ministries over and over again, you might think it's because they're clinging to their positions and don't want anyone else to take it from them. (We "Boomers" are kind of known for that...). But there's another explanation: They might be doing the same things over and over because there are NOT other people stepping in to do them. So, on behalf of the older crowd, I'd like to say Please, replace us! Or maybe we could work alongside each other in this Body of Christ.

Before we can be a serving presence in the community around us, our parish needs to be healthy, itself. And in many ways, it is. But what is missing is the next generation or two, stepping into the ministries that keep our worship alive and thriving, that welcome those who arrive for worship, that collect the offering at each Mass, who help ensure safety and comfort, who proclaim the Word and offer the Eucharist to their brothers and sisters, who make the music that calls us to communal song, and who serve the priest at the altar.

Consider, please, what gifts God has entrusted to you for the service of His Church. Don't "volunteer" because "we need you." Step forward, please, when you recognize that God is calling you to serve in some specific way.
