



Source and Summit

The liturgical documents of the Second Vatican Council coined a phrase that a lot of people in my line of work like to use from time to time: "Source and Summit." The context is that the Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life. Pondering this for a few moments would go a long way toward making the Eucharistic Revival happen in our community.

Full disclosure: the actual text is "font and summit." But "source and summit" really rolls off the tongue and sticks in the mind, so everybody who says this says it that way. But what does it mean?

The Eucharist is the summit of our Christian life. We are drawn through the waters of Baptism, through the anointing with Chrism (Confirmation), and then to the Table of the Eucharist. And while we are Baptized and Confirmed once in life, we return to the Table over and over again as our hunger for union with Christ can only be satisfied there.

The Eucharist is the summit of our formation, too, and not just as a child. As adults, we will do well to pursue knowledge, understanding, and growth in our faith throughout life. Add regular, focused prayer, and we will find ourselves in a cycle of approaching the Table of the Eucharist frequently and of feeling the sense of being sent forth — the sense of mission — that makes the Eucharist the source of our Catholic Christian life.

Ideally, then, we will want to seek opportunities for personal spiritual growth as well as opportunities for mission or service, so that the Eucharist becomes not a destination but a regular source of nourishment for our spirit, our mind, and even our body. True food and real drink, the Eucharist literally (this is literally the proper use of "literally") brings Christ into our body and our spirit.

Abrupt transition. Stay with this; it all comes together shortly...

Last December, just over 100 volunteers worked together to realize Fr. Evelio's vision of a Nativity display that would welcome people from all over the community, whether Catholic or not, to St. Peter's to spend some time contemplating over 50 Nativity sets, arranged in most beautiful way in the Chapel and Narthex of our church.

Recently some of those 100 people, having had a taste of a deeper involvement in parish have asked, "what else is there for me to do?" The answer View this bulletin online at www.parisheonline.com

is *ministry*. Ministry is a service of some kind, performed in the name of Christ and the Church, which has specific definition and limits, and draws on the *Charisms* (gifts, but in a particular sense) that the Holy Spirit has placed uniquely within each one of us. And it is the Eucharist that sends us out to discern and do some ministry that is our call.

Just by looking around, you can spot some ministries, all of which have room for you, if you feel called to one of them: lector, singer, Communion minister, usher, greeter, server (usually for young people), catechist, aide, musician (singers are musicians), live stream camera operators, and more.

There are other ministries that our parish would like to be doing, but isn't yet, either because there is no one to create, define, lead, and carry them out. There are certainly enough people in the parish to do these yet-unfulfilled ministries, but perhaps the call has not been articulated or heard.

You've probably picked up, by now, the idea that this is going to be a series. But here's a teaser to ensure that you'll be back for more...

Ministries needed but not yet in existence in our parish: Ministry to the dying. Liaison with Christian Neighbors to support outreach to those in need, and to develop additional outreach services that are needed, but outside of Christian Neighbors' scope. Ministry to those who need extra support in practical ways so that they may live safely and comfortably in their own home for a few years longer than they could on their own. Youth ministry (needs a staff person for coordination; this is on the drawing board.) And more about ministries and the Charisms that drive them, next time.

Stations of the Cross Fridays at 7:00pm

Come, reflection and pray on the Passion of Jesus and what it means to you.



The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same

pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus. This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread.
