Holy Week

As you read this, we are entering Holy Week. Beginning with "Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion" and continuing with the Chrism Mass on Tuesday afternoon, and concluding with the three-day liturgical celebration of the Passion, Death, and resurrection of Jesus (the "Triduum"), this week really is the pinnacle of the Liturgical year.

Palm Sunday is an emotional roller-coaster. It begins with the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. It's triumphal, but to me it also seems a bit tongue-in-cheek. The "hosannas" are sincere, but riding on a donkey on a path flanked by waving palm branches ... well, it wouldn't be much of a stretch to see this as a parody of the pompous actions of the Romans. In Arizona and Florida, you pay people to take palm branches away; they're yard trash. I like to think that Jesus has a sense of humor and irony.

But after the festive "hosannas," the mood changes with the proclamation of the Passion. This year, we will hear Mark's account of the Last Supper, the prayer in the garden, and the arrest, trial, and crucifixion of Jesus. This is the first of two times during this week when we will hear the reading of the Passion. The other is on Good Friday; it's always from the Gospel of John.

On Tuesday (this is arbitrary; it could be any day in Holy Week up to Thursday morning) the Chrism Mass takes place at the cathedral. There, the priests and deacons of the diocese celebrate their ordination with a sense of renewal, after which the bishop blesses the holy oils that will be used in every parish throughout the coming year. The oils are OC (Oil of Catechumens), OI (Oil of the Sick), and SC (Sacred Chrism).

The Triduum (Latin, meaning "three days") begins on Thursday evening with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. At this Mass, the Gospel text is from John and describes Jesus's washing of His disciples' feet as the central action of the Last Supper. John's Gospel doesn't mention bread and wine in its account of the Last Supper. It's a powerful reminder that service in humility is inseparable from the rest of the Eucharist experience.

The Triduum really is three days, by the way: by biblical tradition, the day starts at sundown, so Thursday night-Friday, Friday night-Saturday, and Saturday night-Sunday makes three days.

The Liturgy of Holy Thursday doesn't have a dismissal; it moves from the Table of the Eucharist to the place of repose for the Blessed Sacrament,

representing Jesus's prayer and the disciples' vigil in the Garden of Gethsemane.

The Liturgy on Good Friday is a continuation of Thursday's, with readings from Scripture, including the Passion from the Gospel of John, Solemn Intercessions, Adoration of the Cross, and Holy Communion (but not a complete Mass). Again, there is no dismissal, as the liturgy of the Triduum continues...

The Great Vigil begins after dark on Saturday evening: 9 pm in our diocese. In the darkness, we light a fire, bless it, and inaugurate a new Paschal Candle. We listen to seven readings from the Old Testament, an Epistle reading and the Gospel account of the Resurrection (or rather, the discovery of the empty tomb). We bless fresh water in the Baptismal Font, we baptize anyone who has prepared for baptism (no one in our parish this year, but several are on the journey to next Easter). We will celebrate the Confirmation of Jose Castañeda, renew our own Baptismal promises, and be sprinkled with the newly blessed water for this year. The Mass continues normally after all that.

On Easter morning, unbridled joy at the news that He who was dead is now risen in glory! And then we can say the "A" word once again!

Don't miss any of this! Plan to be a part of the Triduum in its entirety, and be prepared to experience Easter joy to its fullest!


