


NORMS FOR RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

It is important to remember that the complete Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ is contained in both species of Eucharist. Anyone uncomfortable receiving from the chalice is not required to do so, but it is an offering that is permitted after receiving the Eucharistic Bread (Body of Christ) for a deeper experiential receiving.

Receiving Jesus into our very being at Mass through the Eucharist is actually us becoming one with God and with each other as the mystical body of Christ. Jesus prayed that we may be one as God is one in the Trinity. This is why we must be in a State of Grace before receiving (Sacramental Confession for any Mortal Sins we are aware of in our lives). This is also why Jesus says that if we are approaching the altar and become aware of a dispute with a brother or sister, we must leave our gifts at the altar and go and be reconciled with them before coming back to the altar.

When we approach the minister that is distributing communion with either the Body or the Blood, we make a profound bow from the hips prior to receiving (or we can genuflect or kneel). When we hear either "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ" - Respond with a clear and loud "AMEN" before receiving. Amen is stating that I truly believe that this is the true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus. It is an act of faith.

Receiving the Body



If receiving in the hand, please put your non-dominate hand over your dominate hand making a throne for the body.

The body is to be brought to the mouth with the dominate hand and **consumed in the presence of the minister.** (Inspect your hands for fragments and consume with your tongue, if any are present).



If receiving on the tongue, please open your mouth wide

please open your mouth wide enough and bring your tongue far enough out for the minister to place the body onto it. Stick

your tongue straight out slowly and draw it back into your mouth slowly.

Receiving the Blood



After being offered the Chalice from the minister and saying "AMEN," take the Chalice and a sip of the Precious Blood, then hand the Chalice back to the minister. Please be aware that there may be people behind you who also wish to receive. Please ensure not to drain the chalice, leaving others without.



Intinction or dipping the Body into the Blood is forbidden, except for a ordained priest or bishop.



Nativity of John the Baptist

FIRST CENTURY FEAST DAY: JUNE 24

n the Gospels, John, a kinsman of Jesus through their mothers, preached repentance and baptized to prepare for the Messiah's coming. This feast marks his exceptional birth to the aged priest Zechariah and the equally aged and barren Elizabeth. The angel Gabriel announces his birth in a vision to Zechariah, who hesitates in believing and is struck mute until eight days after John's birth. Then, Zechariah, in a beautiful canticle that ends the first chapter of Luke's Gospel, proclaims that John "will be called prophet of the Most High." John's eventual beheading is commemorated with an Aug. 29 feast. A patron saint of Canada and Jordan, John is also the patron of Florence and the Knights Hospitaller of St. John.
