Greetings to my brothers and sisters in Christ,



The Mass 2025, Issue Eleven

Last week we completed the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, and we are on the cusp of entering into the Liturgy of the Eucharist. I wanted to push the pause button before continuing our journey through the Mass, and into the Liturgy of the Eucharist, to discuss what is happening during the Mass in the invisible Church. We just professed our belief in the Church, visible and invisible. At the Catholic Mass, we must realize that we are not recreating something, or just remembering a past event, or doing actions that represent the true event that is in our history. What is happening is we are re-presenting the actual event, and this will become abundantly clear in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

During Mass we leave our concept of time and space behind, which is a creation of God, and we enter into the timeless. At the Catholic Mass all time collides – past, present, and future – and we are present in the same upper room that the last supper took place, and we are partaking in that very event. We are standing on Calvery at the very crucifixion of Jesus; we are present at that very moment. We use language like remembrance and memory, but the Greek word that is actually used is Anamnesis. Thomas Griffin of Ascension Press explains it in this way. He says, "Anamnesis provides the details for why the Church has always taught that Christ is not re-sacrificed at each Mass, but that we enter into that one moment in history when he was scourged for our offenses and wounded for our sin. Jesus' death defeated evil's strongest consequence, death. Since death is a reality that impacts all people of all times, his victorious suffering stands outside of time. Therefore, at Mass the veil of time is torn open, and we kneel in the presence of that divine moment, which conquers what appears to be unconquerable" (https://ascensionpress.com/blogs/articles/anamnesis-and-the-key-to-the-mass). We are truly there at that very moment with God.

Also, at the Mass we are present with the Communion of Saints. We believe in the Church, visible and invisible, therefore, present among us are the saints and angels, we are there praying together. During the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we hear the priest say, at the end of the preface prayer, something like, "And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim," and all respond, "Holy, Holy, Holy" (Roman Missal). We are not alone, but we are at Mass with our heavenly brothers, sisters, and all the angels – we worship together as the one Body of Christ.

Bishop Robert Barron, in his book *What Christians Believe*, which you will be gifted from the parish today, says this about our common liturgical praise, "From the beginning, Christian worship has had a transcendent orientation and mystical meaning. That is to say, it is infinitely more than the gathering of like-minded people for the purpose of mutual support and shared praise; it is an act performed in conscious union with the saints and angels in heaven and under the headship of the ascended Christ" (p.86).

Being at Mass is not a burden, but a gift from God to us. God allows us to partake in His mysteries. We gathered together, the triumph of the cross led us into the sacred space of the sanctuary, we reverenced God, we were greeted by the priest in the name of the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit, we asked forgiveness for our failings, we sang gloria, we prayed, listened to the Word of God in the Scriptures, listened to an explanation in the homily, professed our faith, and prayed for the whole world in the universal prayers. Now we enter the mystery of the Eucharist. I am very excited to continue our journey through the Mass as we enter into the Liturgy of the Eucharist this Advent Season.
